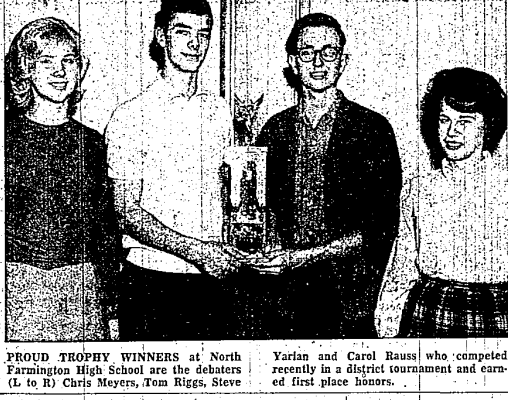

'Captivity of The Suburban Church' Topic
"The Captivity of the Suburban Church" is the topic of the Rev. Robert Miles Eddy's sermon at the Universalist-Unitarian Church of Farmington at 10 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 16.
The talk will be the last of a series of three sermons dealing with the relationships between the inner city and 'the suburbs'.
In Dr. Eddy's view, the problems of a suburban church facing in both ministering to its members and facing its responsibilities to the larger community, and point to some possible solutions.
The ethical discussion group, led by Robert Nelson of Farmington at 11 a.m. following the service, will continue its consideration of parent-child relationships. Two questions to be asked are: "What parental attitude should we have toward anger in the 4-6 year old?" and "Should our parental attitude toward the retarded in the family vary according to the object of the anger, be it parents, siblings or playmates?"
Another group led by John Hillman will continue its discussion of racial equality. Church school classes will be in session from 10 a.m. to noon.

Egyptian Jew At Community Church Nov. 24
Mr. Eddie Levine, now working with the Israel's Benevolent Mission of Detroit, will speak at the Southfield Community Church, 2122 Indian (between Beech and Lakeland, East of Eight Mile) on Sunday evening, November 24, at 7 p.m., according to Pastor Raymond Bayne.
Mr. Levine was born and educated in Alexandria, Egypt. He was converted to Christianity while attending college there. He later went to South Africa and worked amongst the Jewish people in Johannesburg for 17 years. He has recently come to Detroit and is conducting Bible classes amongst Jewish people in the Detroit area.
ALTHOUGH HIS native tongue is French, he also speaks Italian, German, Yiddish, Greek, Arabic and Afrikaans.
He has a fascinating story to tell of his life and experiences.
Rev. Earl Rosenberger will speak in the morning service of November 24, while Pastor Bayne preaches at a church in Urbana, Illinois.
The church will observe its annual Thanksgiving Day Service at 10:30 a.m. with a service of praise. The service will be preceded by a Thanksgiving breakfast held by the young people of junior high, high school and college age.
