## Lack of Citizen Interest Disheartening

Like a stuck phonograph record, after every school election we feel compelled to comment on the poor turnout of voters and the apathy that seems to prevail locally regarding matters of school district wide importance.

'We know that we are scolding like a mother or dad would his young child for having done something wrong, and are reasonably certain that many people resent it. Since this is directed to an all-

rdsent it. Since this is directed to an âlt-adult audience over 21 years of age, per-haps it is not our place to do so and most likely it is a wrong approach.

'Very frankly, however, we know of no other approach. We are quite dis-satisfied with the success we have had during the past few years in getting a greater percentage of local voters out to decide on important school tax pro-posals and select candidates to direct the operations of our mammoth and con-tinually growing public school system. When you have suich important pro-

tinually growing public school system. When you have sisch important proposals as a \$5 million bond issue and operating miliage proposals involving \$5 per \$1,000 equalized valuation in taxes to decide on and can still get only 28½ percent of the community's voters out to register their views, it is rather disheartening. While it is a little better turnout that we have ever had before it is still far from good enough.

It is particularly disheartening when you consider all the time and effort which was put forth preparatory to the election. School officials and many others spent numerous hours preparing information for voters. Many traveled to all parts of the district to explain the proposals to be voted on and answer any questions which citzens might have had.

How many deaths and serious injuries is it going to take to convince county road officials that there is a real need for a traffic light at 13 Mile and Middle-belt Road? We're not talking about flasher or blinker lights but a full fledged red and green traffic control light.

This is a question that not only we have a lot of citizens living in the vicinity of this, "killer" intersection or having to drive on 13 Mile or Middlebelt in this area have been asking for some time now.

Last week in two separate accidents another driver was killed and 15 more injured. It is the second fatality at this intersection so far this year. There have been many more accidents at this spot in recent months where serious injuries

in recent months where serious injuries have been suffered.
Very frankly, we're getting a little sick of hearing the report come back that a traffic count has been made and that the number of vehicles using these main artery roads at this location does not warrant a red light. There has got to be some other basis than volume of traffic alone on which to base a decision on whether or not a stop light is needed. Some stronger pressure has got to be

have been put on half-day schedules in the near future.

Rejection of the operating proposals would have meant that officials would have had to operate the school system with a half million dollars or more less than they feel is needed. Sharp program-curtailments would have been certain. Not only is local apathy about school district affairs demonstrated at the polls but also at official Board of Education meetings. At most of the regular Board of Education meetings we find ourselves alone with Board members and top school officials.

Where are the interested citizens who want to know where and how the bulk of their tax dollars are being spent and the whys and wherefores of various school district operating policies that are discussed and acted upon, we often ask when more citizen interest is shown

ourselves.

Much more citizen interest is shown in City and Township governmental board meetings and they only spend a small amount of local taxpayers money in comparison with the Board of Education.

As we have stated in the past, we feel our school officials are doing an exceptionally good job, of running our public school system. Even though we do feel this way, however, we do not feel that local citizens should "rubber stamp" everything they do or propose to do.

An efficiently functioning governing board will continue to function efficiently as long as there are some citizens' checks held upon them. The only way that the Board of Education will ever know whether they are satisfactorily carrying out the citizenty's wishes is if they express themselves not only at the polls but at officials meetings as well.

Our carnest appeal to you is — Let's start taking a more active interest in Farmington School District affairs.

We have heard some comments about getting too many stop lights too close together in our community.


Our reaction to this is that it would be worth a little inconvenience and time lost in making a few more stops if it will keep serious injury and fatal, accidents from happening.
