Christmas Basketball Tournney Pairings Set

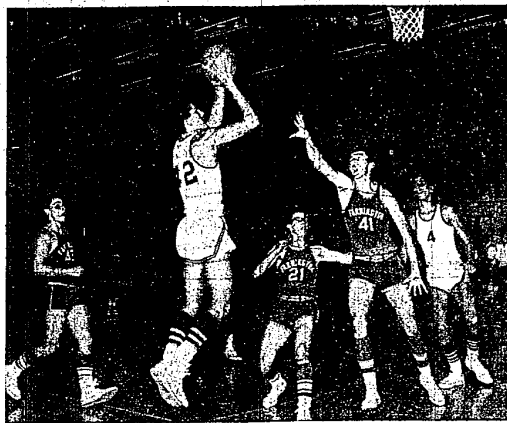

The winners of the Friday night games will play at 7 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. in the Bentley Gym Saturday night, December 28. The losers will meet in consolation games Saturday afternoon.

The Championship game will be played at 8:30 p.m. on Monday night, December 30, also at Bentley with consolation games scheduled earlier in the day.
