

LEGAL NOTICE

SEWER CONNECTION CHARGE ORDINANCE

This Ordinance is adopted by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington under the authority granted to it by Act 185 of the Public Acts of 1957, as amended, for the purpose of providing for charges for the connection of properties and for the initial furnishing of sewer disposal services to properties by and/or through the Township of Farmington Sewer Disposal System.

THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

1. That no parcel of property within the Township of Farmington shall hereafter be connected directly or indirectly to that trunk sewer known as the Thirteen Mile Road Arm of the Farmington Sewer Disposal System until the owner thereof shall have first obtained a permit for such connection and shall have paid to the Township Treasurer a connection charge as follows at the time of application for such permit.

(a) For each dwelling unit located or to be located upon such parcel of property, the sum of \$150.00. A "dwelling unit" is defined as any building, portion of a building or other enclosure, including house trailers or mobile homes, designed for occupancy by one family for residential purposes and having cooking facilities. With respect to trailer parks, every trailer space equipped or to be equipped with sewage disposal facilities shall be deemed to be a dwelling unit whether or not such space is actually occupied by a trailer at the date of the application.

(b) For other than dwelling units, a sum to be fixed by resolution of the Township Board in determining such sum due to the relative benefits to be obtained by the particular use of occupancy involved, by the availability of sewage disposal facilities as compared to the benefit obtained by a single dwelling unit, including, but not limited to, the relative amounts of sanitary sewage to be discharged into the sewer system.

2. The sums so paid to the Township Treasurer shall be deposited by him in a separate bank account to be known as the "Thirteen Mile Road Arm of the Farmington Sewer Disposal System" and shall be used for the purpose of the payment of the Township's obligation under certain contracts between the Township and the Farmington Public School District and divers other persons for the construction of the initial portion of said trunk sewer until said obligation has been discharged and thereafter to be used solely for the construction of extensions of the said Thirteen Mile Road Arm until said Arm is fully completed. Any sums collected thereafter or remaining in said account may be transferred as may be determined by the Township Board.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its publication in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.
