**Get 181 Pints At Blood Bank**

A total of 233 donors turned out for the community blood bank held last week and from this number a total of 181 pints of blood were received for the local bank which had been established since the last blood bank was held.

It was necessary to reject 53 persons who were desirous of giving because they had too much iron in their blood or were not in top physical condition to be able to give safely without the possibility of undesirable after-effects.

Local industrial plants had many of their workers in to give blood but church groups did not turn out as many as had been hoped for from them. Mrs. DeWitt Goodrich, blood bank chairman, stated.

Those who helped with the blood bank in any way can be proud of the job done, she commented. Mrs. Goodrich also pointed out that the dinner served to blood bank workers had been donated by the First Presbyterian Church and served by women's organizations from Our Lady of Sorrows and St. Alexander's Catholic churches.

Mary Lent, stress worker for the community blood bank and chairman for many years until her recent serious illness, was at the bank most of the day and an inspiration to all workers and donors to continue in their efforts to keep an adequate community blood bank established.

**Council Okays Dance Permit**

After getting a detailed report on the purposes for which Bel-Aire Lanes has requested approval for a dancing permit, the City Council voted unanimously Monday night in favor of the firm being issued one.

City Manager John Dittus' report to the Council revealed that the proprietors of the bowling and restaurant establishment had stated that they wanted the permit only so that they could allow dancing in their private banquet room. They stated that they have no intention of allowing dancing in the cocktail lounge, he said.

The public safety department's only recommendation on the basis of its investigation was that five exits in the banquet room be so designated and that the outside exits be used only for out-going movement of people.

The safety department was satisfied that a sufficient amount of parking area existed near the establishment, the report said.

**Two More Apt. Developments Slated for Twp.**

Two rezoning requests to permit good sized apartment developments in Farmington Township and a preliminary plat for a 210-home single family residential development are now under consideration by the Farmington Township Zoning Board.

Most of the last regular Zoning Board meeting was spent discussing the plans for these three proposed large developments but no action on any was taken. Renewed discussion will be held at the next regular meeting of the Zoning Board on Thursday, Dec. 19.

Whether or not dates for public hearings on the two proposed developments which will require rezoning will be set at the Dec. 19 meeting or not was not indicated.

One of the rezoning requests has been made by Max Sheldon who wishes to provide a terrace-garden apartment type development on a 25-acre parcel of land at the southwest corner of Middlebelt and 14 Mile Road just south of the Eagle Elementary School. In conjunction with the apartment development he proposes 3.3 acres of the parcel to be used for the development of an office district complex and 2.2 acres for commercial stores.

Approximately 50 homeowners present at the meeting of the Zoning Board from Luchmoor and Briarcrest streets which are adjacent to this vacant parcel stated that they wanted present zoning standards in this area upheld. It was their expressed feeling that the type of development proposed by Sheldon would be a downgrading of the area.

The other apartment development is proposed on a parcel of the east side of Middlebelt Road north of Ten Mile which is presently zoned for single family residential development. Proponent of this proposed development is the Arlye Land Co. of Southfield, represented by Dr. Z. Smolke.

Board members indicated that they wanted to look this property over very carefully before entering into further discussion on the development proposed.

The large single family residential development which was preliminary plat plan was submitted on this for an approximately 210-home development on 103 acres of land on the south side of 14 Mile Road east of Middlebelt Road, numbered 14100-14199. In the proposed plans were questioned and the proponent of the development, Les Taubman, was asked to have some redesigning done and re-submit the plans.

Brennan was referring to an African lioness owned by Robert Russell of Farmington Road who won a court battle with the Township earlier this year to keep his pet. The new law cannot be made retroactive, however, to reverse Judge Allen's decision in favor of Russell.

IN COMMENTING on the extensive work done on the new Zoning Amendments, Township Supervisor Curt Hall praised Brennan for his efforts. Brennan worked with the consulting firm of Vilcan and Leman and with members of the Township Zoning Board in drafting the new amendments.

A total of three public hearings were held by the Township to allow citizens an opportunity to state their opinions concerning proposed changes and many subsequent meetings took up the issues which were involved. The new series of amendments in Brennan's words, adds "flexibility" to the Township Zoning Ordinance and offers more effective means to control situations likely to arise here.


