

Consumers to Spend \$2,000,000 In Area in 1964

More than \$2 million will be invested by Consumers Power Company in its West Wayne division, headquartered at Livonia, during 1964 on projects to expand and improve the company's natural gas service. James P. Thomas, Jr., division manager, announced this week.

The West Wayne division includes the communities of Wayne; Plymouth, Northville, Farmington, Wixom and Livonia plus many other communities in Lyon, Novi, Bloomfield, Farmington, Nankin, Plymouth and Salem townships.

Thomas said principal projects include the installation of some 50 miles of new gas distribution mains and a related equipment to meet the needs of an anticipated 3,500 new customers which the division expects to add during the year.

In addition, parts of the system serving some 300 existing customers will also be either expanded or improved, assuring continued good service in older parts of the division area.
