

Seeks Prosecuting Attorney Office in Oakland County

Senior Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Robert L. Templin today announced that he will be a candidate for the Republican nomination for Prosecuting Attorney of Oakland County.

Mr. Templin, a member of the Prosecutors' state since 1959, has specialized in trial work and the handling of appellate cases in the Supreme Court.

PRIOR TO entering the general practice of law in 1958, Mr. Templin spent 10 years in industry, serving on the staff of the Vice-President, Ford Motor Co., as a specialist in organizational matters and as a member and Director of the American Standard Electronics Corporation (ASECO). During World War II Mr. Templin was a First Lieutenant in the Army Air Force, saw action as a 35th Bomber Navigator with the 13th Air Force in the European Theatre of Operations. He received an A.B. degree in Economics from the University of

Michigan in 1949 and a Bachelor of Laws degree from the Detroit College of Law in 1952.

Mr. Templin is currently Chairman, Committee on Public Relations, Oakland County Bar Association and a member of the Committee on Criminal Jurisprudence and the Grievance Committee of the State Bar Association. Also a member of the National District Attorney's Association, he has lectured extensively on Criminal Jurisprudence throughout the state and other legal associations.

LONG ACTIVE in Republican politics as a precinct worker, Mr. Templin is currently Vice-President of the Lincoln Republican Club and was area chairman of the recent Neighbor-to-Neighbor Finance Campaign in Bloomfield Township where he resides with his wife.

Mr. Templin is particularly interested in the handling of cases involving indigent defendants and teenage offenders and plans to place more emphasis on the present "Off the Record Court" as initially formulated by George F. Taylor.

In addition, Mr. Templin has planned to establish regular courses of instruction in general practice of law in 1958, cooperation with the various agencies to assist these agencies and their representatives in coping with the increasing legal matters and law enforcement law enforcement.

Workshop Held For Elementary Art Teachers

Miss Anne McDonough, Art Consultant for the American Crayon Company conducted an art workshop for more than 30 Farmington Elementary Classroom teachers last Wednesday at Highmead Elementary School.

THE IDEAS FOR projects were some that have been developed at the New York studios of the company by their experimental art consultants. The group made exciting paper lanterns which with a variation or two in stapling could be changed into party hats or paper mobiles. They made felt paper mache birds which after painting and Jeweling they caged in paper cages of their own design.

THE WORKSHOP continued after the dinner hour which found the teachers experimenting in painting and print techniques. A project in crayon resist demonstrated some of the possibilities of combining materials for further experimentation.

Teachers from each of the elementary buildings in Farmington participated in the project. The workshop was shared with the other teachers and with the students.
