The letter was forwarded to local city officials by the Oak Park City Council.

The Detroit couple credited former Sgt. Foltz with saving the life of their daughter who was seriously injured in an auto accident in Oak Park on January 18. It was their expressed hope that if it had not been for the quick and skillful action of Foltz at the time of the accident their daughter would very likely have died.

The other car, driven by George F. Valassis, 34, of Detroit, was heading south on Orchard Lake Road. Valassis and two women passengers, Nancy Valassis, of Detroit, and Delores Overfield, 36, of 32402 Sprucewood in Farmington, sustained minor injuries.

This matter has not come up for official action before the township board as yet. Clerk Floyd Cairns stated Tuesday, however, that he was not taking applications and would be for approximately the next 30 days. He indicated that official action on details relative to the matter would probably be taken up at the next regular meeting of the township board this coming Monday night.

The Farmington Board of Education discussed the matter at its last regular meeting but took no official action setting a firm deadline for applications or in determining whether or not pay would be granted to members of the board of canvassers.

The Clarenceville Board of Education was one of the first local governing bodies to start taking applications and agreed at an earlier session to pay board of canvassers members \$55 a piece for each election they canvass.

No information was given by officials of either of the villages relative to details except that they were accepting applications from interested parties at this time.

A new innovation in Brookside Club apartments will be the indoor year-round swimming club and community room. Rather than install an outdoor pool which is used only by a relatively few days of the year, Brookside Club will have a kidney shaped indoor pool with a huge bar-b-q fireplace overlooking the pool side parties, at the tenants.

Locker room facilities, bath facilities and all other necessary items are included.

Sliding doors to a porch built into the air over the swimming pool will be made possible by designing the community building on the edge of the ravine between apartments and overlooking the view. The upper level will also have a huge country fireplace and bar-b-q facilities and provide a room for other activities.

The community house will have a beamed ceiling, huge hand-holders, walnut paneling, fireplace, a grand piano and quality furniture.

THE SITE also has Edison, Gas, Telephone, Sewer, Side-walks, Bus Service, and many other services available.

The U.S. Interstate 30 passes within a half mile of the location, and the new U.S. 69 Expressway, running from Brighton to Algonquin crossing the bridge, and eventually connecting with the residents of Brookside will be able to drive down to Downtown Detroit non-stop from Farmington.
