N. Farmington Debaters Win District Tournament

North Farmington's Varsity Debate Squad qualified for first place in the district tournament. Birmingham Seaborn, Royal Oak Deacons and University of Detroit High School tied for second place. These three schools and North Farmington will participate in the regional meet on March 7 at the University of Michigan. Here they will compete with 20 other district winners.

The NF debating squad will receive an engraved championship plaque for their 5-win, 1-loss record at the district meet. All three second place teams and a 4-win, 2-loss record. The top high school teams winning the regionals will compete for the state title at Grand Rapids.

Of thirty-four judged debates the Varsity Squad has lost only three. North Farmington has been rated by the University of Michigan as one of the "top ten high school debating powers in Michigan."

Coach Rohm said "things look good" for next year's team since many students have signed up for "debate and discussion," a class to be held next September.

The local forensics contest will be held on March 3 and 4 for interpretive reading, humorous reading, oratory, extemporaneous and declamation divisions. There are forty-five people in competition and the judges will be Mrs. Chamberlain, Mrs. Trowbridge, Mr. Kinney, Mrs. Koski, Mr. Voss, and Mr. L. Smith.
