## Raider Cagers Pull Upset To Tie For League Championship

North Farmington rocked the Thurston Eagles Friday, Feb. 28, for a share of the league championship.

The Raiders whose conference record is now 7-1, shut down THS's 12 game winning streak, with a 68-59 conquest before a packed and cheering crowd on the Eagles' hardwoods.

A tight first quarter found the Raiders one up 14-13, as senior guard Ray Dhue dumped in six.

The second period spelled defeat for Thurston as Mike Fleming completely dominated both offensive and defensive boards, while collecting 8 points in the 23 point period. With a 37-21 score showing on the scoreboard, the Raiders took a 13 point bulge into the locker room, only 16 minutes from the conference title.

Thurston's fired up squad outscored Northern in the third period, closing the gap to two, 49-47. Twice the Eagles tied North Farmington in the fourth period but crucial baskets by senior forward Jim Uhl kept the Raiders in control.

North Farmington placed four players in double figures. Mike Fleming led with 16 points, while Jim Uhl, Ray Dhue and John McDonald all collected 14. Game honors were taken by Thurston's Paul Lawson with 21.

Three days preceding the Raiders won the most important non-league battle of the season as they defeated their southern neighbors 52-51. After the first period the Raiders completely dominated play with as much as a 17 point bulge over the Farmington Falcons. The start of the final period found NF up 46-31.

The Falcons, playing with restless abandon and a pressing defense managed to pull within three points before the buzzer sounded, however, a Raider foul led to South Farmington's final two points.

## Deputy Atty Gen To Speak Here

Cohen, the number two man in the Attorney General's office, will speak on "The New Civil Rights Commission, Its Powers and Potentials."

HE WILL DESCRIBE the authority of the commission created under Michigan's new Constitution and the role of the growing number of human relations organizations, such as that in Farmington.

A native of Detroit, Cohen has been Attorney General Frank Kelley's deputy since 1961 and before that was an assistant attorney general. A graduate of Wayne State University, he practiced law in Detroit before joining the Attorney General's staff.
