### Wants Old Buildings Fixed or Closed Up

Councilman Howard Thayer pointed out at the regular city council meeting Monday night that he was very much concerned with the ramshackle and unsightly conditions of a few homes and properties in the city.

He was supported by other councilmen in his contention that health officials should be called in to make a thorough inspection of these buildings and grounds and that orders should be given owners to take corrective measures, or the buildings should be closed up by the city.

### Township Board Proceedings

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington Township Board was held at the city hall on Monday, March 2, A.D. 1964 at 8:05 p.m. by Mr. Curt Hall, Chairman. Members present were Hall, Avery, Duke, Oppenheimer, Bassette and Walter; Clairus absent. Also present was Mr. Joseph T. Brennan, Township Attorney.

Minutes for Regular Meeting of February 10, 1964 stand approved as published.

MOTION by Avery, supported by Walter, that consideration or Ordinance to regulate hours of pool and billiard room be tabled until next meeting. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Avery, supported by Oppenheimer, that the Township Board give tentative approval to Preliminary Planned Unit Development Plat of Old Farmington Towne Subdivision as presented, subject to the following:

1. That the Developer shall present plans and specifications for the development of the park areas (Outlets A and B) prior to filing Final Plat for approval of the Township Board.
2. That the Township Attorney be instructed to prepare a contract, setting forth the conditions upon which final approval is to be based, to be presented to the Township Board for approval prior to the filing of final plat.
3. That a Corporate Security Bond in the estimated cost of the work improvements be filed with the Township Board for the approval of the Board prior to the filing of the final plat.
4. Subject to the approval of the plat by Oakland County Drain Commission, Oakland County Road Commission, Oakland County Health Commission, Traffic Control and Safety Commission, and site drainage engineering.

Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Bassette, supported by Avery, that the Township Supervisor and Clerk be authorized to enter into an Agreement with Bezeley Brothers covering auto-pour with completed. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Duke, supported by Avery, that the Township approve request from George N. and Mildred N. Kibbey for transfer of ownership of 1963-64 SODA licensed business located at 33205 Grand River Avenue, from Louis E. and Amy G. Edsall. 3001 Call Vote, 6-0. Yeas, 6-0. Nays, Carried unanimously.
