Special Navy Enlistment For June Grads



Travelers Aid Society Helps 20 Area Persons

Oneswork by the Travelers Aid Society of Detroit helped 20 area persons who were in trouble while traveling during the past year.

The Travelers Aid Society is a Torch Drive social service agency dedicated to the problems of the traveling public. Altogether, it helped more than 50,000 persons traveling in and out of Detroit during the past year.

About one in 10 of the persons helped is listed as a "Case Case" work is the name given to the member in which a trained social worker involves a person with a problem and helps him toward a solution. One definition of case work is that it is the art of helping others to help themselves.

ANYONE MAY NEED Travelers Aid service while traveling. TA workers see every sort of person from the carnie wanderer to the corporate official. Problems come to them from hitchhikers and first class passengers.

During a two-week period handicapped, 112 were mentally last year. Society workers

asked everyone who came to them for help where they were from. They obtained answers from 3,041 people. Of these, 38 per cent came from Detroit, 13.3 per cent from the Tri-County area, and 12.2 per cent from outside Michigan.

Another 7.6 came from Eastern States, 6.2 per cent from the South and Porto Rico, 3.2 per cent from Western States, including Alaska and Hawaii. They came from 48 different states. Another 3.3 per cent came from Canada and 3.8 per cent from foreign countries, including Australia, Ecuador, Egypt, Great Britain, Haiti, India, Iran, Japan, Mexico, Nigeria, Portugal, Uruguay, and Yugoslavia.

The effectiveness of the Travelers Aid Society of Detroit is due to the fact that it is one of a nationwide network of similar societies, making it possible to work with trained social workers in other cities in solving the problems of people away from home.

SPRING HOME IMPROVEMENT GUIDE

Painting Can Solve Room Size and Shape Problems

You can "change a room's dimensions" if you know the magic tricks of paint color. In this day, when every room is different, you can make your dream house architecturally, by problem-solving hints from the National Paint, Varnish and Lacquer Association come in handy, indeed.

First, some basic color facts. Light vs. Dark. The lightness or darkness of a color radically affects the illusion of size. Try this test yourself to see how it works. Place side by side identical objects, one in black, the other in white, since these are dark and light extremes. See how the white seems larger and farther away, the black smaller and closer.

So it is with walls. White or pastels (which are only colors tinted generously with white) will open up a small area and "enlarge" it. But if you wish to diminish the wide open spaces of a cavernous room, deep shades will seem to draw walls cozily together.

Now the color itself. You may have heard them described as "warm" or "cool." The easiest way to tell which is which is to relate them to familiar things. Like the sun, like flame, warm colors are variations of orange, red or yellow. They seem nearer to you and make room smaller. Conversely, like the sky, like

water, variations of blue, violet, green and gray are the airier "cools." They make objects appear to recede. Therefore, rooms look larger.

These colors will actually make you feel warmer or cooler mentally. So take this into consideration along with the size of the room.

What Paint to Use Where. Here's a quick run-down on the proper paint to use for any interior surface you may be beautifying. PLASTER WALLS and CEILING—any high quality interior flat paint, oil, alkyl or latex enamel. For bathrooms and kitchens, use semi-gloss or gloss enamel paint for greater washability. WALLBOARD—Seal with primer sealer and then follow with any high quality wall paint. HARDBOARD—seal with latex paint, primer sealer, shellac or enamel undercoat. Use any desired topcoat. PLYWOOD—for an opaque top coat, seal with penetrating "resin" sealer, flat oil or alkyl paint or enamel undercoat. When dry, apply a second coat. For a natural finish which shows the grain, use a clear penetrating resin sealer, followed by varnish. WOODWORK—Semi-gloss enamel in same color as walls. Full gloss is often used in kitchens and bathrooms.

of the room before you paint. For instance, a pastel yellow will seem to enclose you more than a pastel blue, even though they are both pale. So if you're painting a long, narrow corridor you might very well prefer choosing your pastel from the cool family. Speaking of long, narrow rooms, it is best to break them up with color. Favorite decorator tricks are painting the two narrow ends in a deep, warm shade and keeping walls light. This shortens the length considerably to your mind's eye. If the ceiling is abnormally high, pull it together with the floor by painting them both in the same deep shade. Ceiling Rule. In any room, this ceiling rule

holds true: Too high, keep the color low; Too low, lift it with a light color.

A half-wall jutting out from nowhere splits a room's symmetry. Since you can't disguise this architecture, dramatize it with a bright, warm shade. This might be the focal point of a furniture grouping or prize painting. More interest is added to a two-square room with this technique, too.
