'The Deputy' Topic Sunday

'The Deputy, Catholics and Jews' will be the topic of Rabbi Sherwin T. Wines' sermon on March 15, at the Birmingham Temple.

Rabbi Wines will discuss 'The Deputy' which recently opened on Broadway has aroused an international controversy. It accuses the late Pope Pius XII of criminal negligence because he failed to speak out against the Nazi extermination of the Jews.

Pastor Cozadd has had two years experience with Discovery, and will be leading a group this summer through Ireland, Scotland, England and the Scandinavian countries. He has traveled extensively in Europe and is well qualified as a tour escort.

Pastor Cozadd outlined the general plan of Discovery by stating that it is desirable, though not essential, that a first-time visitor to Europe avail himself of the general tour in the countries first so as to absorb the flavor and historic settings necessary to be understood before a concentrated study of any specific country be made; a general tour of Europe followed by a more detailed tour of two or three countries at a time at some later date.

This summer, both the Grand Tour and the British-Scandinavian Tour will leave Detroit on July 14 and return to Detroit on August 13. Discovery is open to everyone interested in more than a fleeting glance of Europe; to those really interested in learning about people and their culture.
