

Township of Farmington Board Proceedings

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington Township Board was called to order on March 19, 1964 at 8:00 p.m. by Mr. Art Hall, Chairman. Members present were Hall, Avery, Calms, Walter, Bassette, Oppenhausser and Duke. Also present was Mr. Joseph J. Brennan, Township Attorney.

Minutes of Last Meeting. Minutes for Regular Meeting of February 21, 1964 stand approved as published.

MOTION by Walter, supported by Bassette, that Clerk be authorized to add name of Village of Franklin to list to be prepared by various Boards. Carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION by Calms, supported by Duke, that the Agreement - Farmington Sewerage District - Township Industrial Area dated as of November 1, 1962, between the County of Oakland and the Township of Farmington, as part of the second part, heretofore executed and delivered by said parties, be and it hereby is amended as provided in Amendment No. 1 to said Agreement, and the revised Exhibit C attached hereto, and that the Township Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver the said Amendment No. 1 on behalf of the Township of Farmington. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Duke, supported by Bassette, that Let of Supervisor's Middlebelt-Ten Mile Subdivision, Section 2, SE 1/4, Township 36 N., Range 10 E., be and it hereby is amended as provided in Amendment No. 2 and No. 3, submitted, with additions with reference to additional paragraph as to the desirability of areas. Surety Bond for sidewalk along Eleven Mile Road, and subject to approval of the Township Board, be and it hereby is amended as to the ability of the property to drain within its boundaries, and that the Clerk be authorized to execute said Final Plat as soon as he is satisfied these conditions have been met. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Duke, supported by Oppenhausser, that the Township Board establish a water special assessment district for Meadowbrook Hills Subdivision No. 1, and Meadowbrook Hills Subdivision No. 2, a part of the 24th of Section 21, T35N, R10E, Farmington Township, and that Pate, Hirm & Bogue, consulting engineers, be and they are authorized to prepare preliminary plans and cost estimates for the same. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Walter, supported by Duke, that the Township Board establish a sewer special assessment district for Heather Hills No. 1, and Heather Hills No. 2, Subdivisions, a part of SE 1/4, Section 21, T35N, R10E, Farmington Township, and that Pate, Hirm & Bogue, consulting engineers, be and they are authorized to prepare preliminary plans and cost estimates for said sewer system. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Duke, supported by Bassette, that the preliminary plans and cost estimates for Heather Hills No. 1, and Heather Hills No. 2, a part of SE 1/4, Section 21, T35N, R10E, Farmington Township, be and they are authorized to prepare preliminary plans and cost estimates for the same. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Calms, supported by Bassette, that the preliminary plans and cost estimates for Heather Hills No. 1, and Heather Hills No. 2, a part of SE 1/4, Section 21, T35N, R10E, Farmington Township, be and they are authorized to prepare preliminary plans and cost estimates for the same. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas; 0 Nays. Carried unanimously.

MOTION by Oppenhausser, supported by Avery, that the Township Board support House Bill No. 22, and that the Clerk be and they are authorized to advise our Representative R. L. Baker, and State Senator F. Robertson, and Governor Romney, that we support this legislation. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Calms presented and read Resolutions to utilize the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago for the safekeeping of the Township securities.
