Falcon Cagers Lose Regional Tourney Clash at Clarkston

A sharp-shooting Mt. Clemens squad hit 70 per cent of their first quarter field goal shots to defeat the Falcon cagers in the first game of the State Regionals by the score of 77-60 at Clarkston, March 12. This high scoring percentage proved to be the fatal blow to Farmington basketball hopes.

The Falcon hoopers saw the Bathers surge ahead by a first quarter score of 24-10. Farmington's Coach Quiggle started the season's stars for the game. Seniors Neil Warriner, Dave Schlack, Bob Lorenz and Junior guards Roy Leach and John Olander began the hardwood battle.

Seniors Greg Wilson and Dan Dustin came in later in the first stanza in an effort to close the gap.

The Falcons valiantly tried to come back in the second and third periods. The cagers actually outscored Mt. Clemens by the score of 16-15 in the second period and matched them 15-15 in the third period. Still, at the end of three stanzas, a 53-40 score showed the first period ravages.

The last quarter brought more comeback rallies from Falcon stars Schlack, Warriner, Olander, Lorenz, Wilson and Lloyd Nichols who were combined to form a five-man squad.

The final quarter scoring ran Farmington, 20 and Mt. Clemens, 21. The season closing game in the way of a 77-60 final score.

Freddy and Cheryl Westdale, who parents Mr. and Mrs. Virgil W. Westdale live at 28845 Highmeadow in Farmington, both staged some spectacular swimming exploits in the South-east District YMCA Swimming Tournament held at Patton

Pool. Seven YMCA teams from all over the metropolitan Detroit area competed in the city championship journey. Freddy and Cheryl helped their Birmingham YMCA team to the first place trophy honors with their fine individual efforts and contributions to the team relay events.

Ten-year-old Freddy set a pool record of :59.9 seconds in the 100-yard individual medley race, also earning first place points for his team.

FREDDY SET two pool records during the season in the 80-yard individual medley event.

In the 100-yard freestyle relay, Freddy helped set a trail of five new pool records, the best time was :45 seconds and he also set a record in the 20-yard backstroke event.

At the Michigan AAU swim tournament held in Garden City, Freddy was on the freestyle relay team which set a new state record of 2:08 minutes in the 200-yard event. He was also sixth in the state with the time of 1:39 seconds for the backstroke.

Cheryl Westdale, who is 11-years-old, was first in the 100-yard freestyle race in the city championships and set four pool records during the course of the season, swimming for the Birmingham YMCA.

CHERYL SWAM a leg on the freestyle relay team which captured first place in the city journey and set a new pool record for 160-yards. She also set two 20-yard freestyle pool records.

Both Cheryl and Freddy are students at Highmeadow School in Farmington.

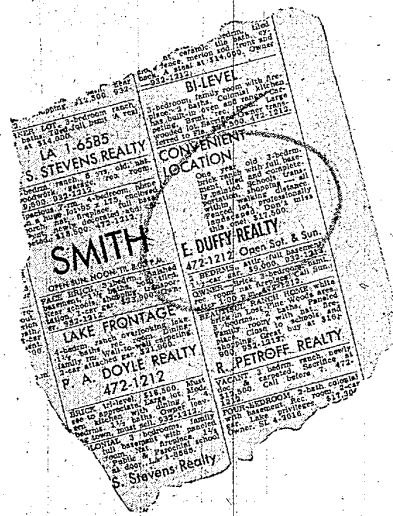

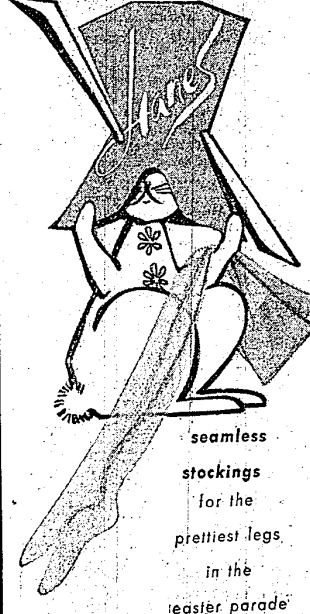
