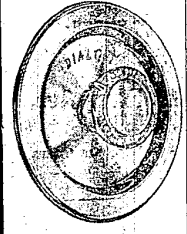
A house that is not properly insulated is drafty in winter, even when doors and windows are tight, and hot in summer. job. Because of this, it costs far more to heat and cool than a home that's well insulated. FHS recognizes this, and by including insulation among projects eligible for its low-cost home improvement loans,

encourages homeowners to add permanent value to their homes by doing a quality insulation job. If proper insulation is added to an existing home, annual heating and cooling bills will be much lower than before. Many families have found that after thoroughly insulating their homes with mineral wool, their fuel bills have been cut so drastically that within a few years the savings have paid for the total cost of the insulation.
