

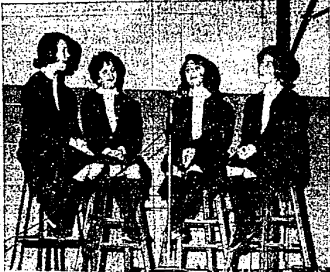
# Young Stars Shine At FHS Talent Show

# SPRING HOME IMPROVEMENT GUIDE

## How to Control For A Shady Spot in Landscape: The Problem Of Crabgrass Tuberous Begonias Suggested

Now is the time to make sure that crabgrass does not become a problem this year in your lawn.

Pre-emergence crabgrass killers should be applied before April 15 for the best results. Crabgrass normally germinates around mid-April. One application of any material containing Zyrcon, Daethal, or Dipan at this time will eliminate crabgrass during the coming year.

All pre-emergence killers destroy seedling as it germinates and will do the same to any grass seed which is sown within 60 days of the application of these materials. Seeding should not be necessary for most lawns. If the competition of crabgrass is removed and the lawn fertilized existing grass will spread making it unnecessary to seed.

In any case, reseeding must be postponed until early fall. Make sure that operations such as fertilization and raking are completed before applying crabgrass killers. If you miss the April 15 date for crabgrass control, by all means apply pre-emergence killers anyway through April.

Later applications reduce the effectiveness of the material. But since crabgrass keeps on germinating for better than a month, a late application is better than having to apply a post-emergence killer during the summer months.

Many chemical companies are making double and triple action materials which in addition to controlling crabgrass contain materials which kill troublesome lawn insects and weeds at the same time. Proper lawn maintenance practices also will discourage crabgrass.

Thick turf tends to discourage the germination of crabgrass seed. Regular fertilization and mowing height of 2-2 1/2" all help to encourage the growth of bluegrasses and therefore discourage crabgrass. Don't look for crabgrass in the shade; it likes the sun and will not be a problem in shady areas.

## Gives Tips on Grass Seed Use

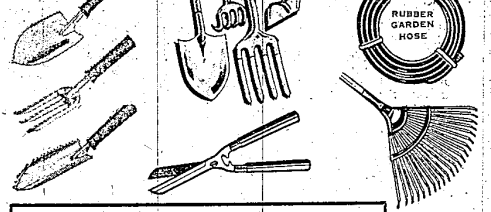
"Michigan lawns should usually be based on bluegrass, fine-leaved red fescues or a combination of the two," according to Carter Harrison, Michigan State University crop scientist.

If bentgrass is included in the mixture, folks should make sure that it is of the Highland or Colonial variety and not the creeping types used on golf courses. When the creeping
