City Budget

(Continued from Page 1A)
The last year's assessed valuation.
The bulk of the money to satisfy this proposed budget will come from two sources. An estimated \$584,201 will come from local property taxes and another \$108,000 from state taxes returned to the city.
THE WATER and sewer department budget is entirely separate from the general budget and is satisfied almost totally through water collection fees. No increase in present water rates is called for even though some improvements to the system are called for. One improvement proposed will be the extension of the water main on Ten Mile west of Power Road where water pressures are critically low. An extensive sewer cleaning program and the replacement of deficient sized hydrants in older sections of the community is also planned.
Approval of the city budget for the coming fiscal year must be made by the Council by mid-May. A public hearing on the budget will be held prior to its adoption by the council but no date for this hearing has yet been set.

Sealed bids for the purchase of Building and Site Bonds, Series 1964, to be issued by Farmington Public School District, Oakland County, Michigan, of the par value of \$2,500,000, will be received by the undersigned, at the office of the Board of Education, 32500 Shiawassee, Farmington, Michigan, until 8:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on Monday, the 27th day of April, 1964, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be dated May 1, 1964, will be coupon bonds in the denomination of \$5,000 each, will be numbered consecutively in the direct order of their maturity from 1 to 500, both inclusive, and will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding 5 per cent per annum, payable on May 1, 1968, and thereafter semi-annually on November 1, and May 1. Each bid shall state the annual interest rate or rates upon which it is submitted, expressed in multiples of 1/8 of 1 per cent. The interest rate for each coupon period on any one bond shall be at the rate or rates and shall be represented by one coupon only. Accrued interest on date of delivery of said bonds must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

Said bonds will mature serially on the first day of May in each of the years 1968 and 1967, \$25,000 in each of the years 1968 through 1975, and \$100,000 in each of the years 1976 through 1983. Bonds maturing in the years 1976 through 1983 are subject to redemption by the school district prior to maturity in inverse numerical order, on any one or more interest payment dates on and after May 1, 1975, at par and accrued interest plus a premium on each bond in accordance with the following schedule:
\$125 if called to be redeemed on or after May 1, 1975, but prior to May 1, 1978.
\$100 if called to be redeemed on or after May 1, 1978, but prior to May 1, 1981.
\$ 75 if called to be redeemed on or after May 1, 1981, but prior to May 1, 1984.
\$ 50 if called to be redeemed on or after May 1, 1984, but prior to May 1, 1987.
\$ 25 if called to be redeemed

on or after May 1, 1987.

The said bonds are a part of \$5,000,000, the issuance of which was approved at a special election held in said school district on November 18, 1963, for the purpose of defraying the cost of erecting, furnishing and equipping new school buildings (including a service building) and additions to existing school buildings (including the administration building), remodeling existing school buildings, acquiring new sites and additions to existing sites for school buildings, and making other improvements to school buildings and sites in said school district, and will be general obligation bonds of the school district, which is authorized and required by law to levy upon all the taxable property therein such ad valorem taxes as may be necessary to pay said bonds and the interest thereon, without limitation as to rate or amount.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds and the interest on each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from May 1, 1964 to their respective maturities and deducting therefrom the premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the school district. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$50,000, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the school district, must accompany each bid and be held as good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the bonds with checks and checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the bidder's acceptance of the terms of the bonds, including the terms of Dickinson, Wright, McKean & Cudlip, attorneys, Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, the cost of said legal opinion and of the printing of the bonds (with the legal opinion) will be paid by the school district. There will also be furnished the usual closing papers, including a non-utility certificate, dated as of the date of delivery of the bonds. Bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan, Chicago, Illinois, or New York, N.Y., at the expense of the school district. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.
