The Farmington Area YMCA is again offering another session of Sex Education for junior high youngsters and their parents at the new East Junior High on Middlebelt at 11 Mile.

Beginning April 30 for three consecutive Thursday nights, the sessions will deal with the anatomy and physiology of the body, maturing socially and spiritually, and the amazing process of human reproduction.

THE RESOURCE leaders for these sessions are Dr. Edwin Blumberg, local physician; Rev. Richard Markham, pastor of the First Methodist Church in Farmington; and Dr. Paul Kaufman, clinical psychologist at the Hawthorne Hospital in Northville.

All three of these people are highly qualified to handle the material and will offer the audience many new insights into their own physical and emotional make-up.

THE OBJECTIVES of the program are four-fold:

- 1.) To achieve a better understanding of the human body and all its processes;
- 2.) To learn of the physiological changes that girls and boys undergo during the adolescent years;
- 3.) To provide a clearer understanding of sex and reproduction;
- 4.) To promote a closer, more comfortable relationship between parents and their youngsters.
