Included in the Farmington AFS booth will be items offered for sale such as imported bulk cheeses and gourmet foods, baskets, old fashioned candy and exotic recipes.

Mayor Robert Lindner has produced an American Field Service Week in Farmington from April 12 through the 18th in honor of the many outstanding contributions of the AFS organization.

HIGHLIGHTING the national observance of "American Field Service Week" will be the speaker and discussion leader at the April 21 meeting of the Clarenceville Jr. High P.T.A. at 8 p.m. in the high school cafeteria.

This show is open to the public without admission.


