Hackendall gave a brief history of civic interest in Clean Up-Paint Up-Fix Up, which dates back to 1912.

Each representative received an organization guide to the Clean Up-Paint Up-Fix Up program, offering suggestions that can be adapted to local effort. Timely Tips on GARDENING

SPRING BLOOM—The golden bells on forsythia bushes are true heralds of Spring. Also brightening the scene are gay red Emperor tulips, fragrant hyacinths, and a variety of daffodils and other narcissi.

NARCISSUS and daffodils are universal Spring favorites. These hardy bulbs, which are members of the Amaryllis family, are found wild in southern Europe and Asia. In addition to the many wild species that flower forming a large trumpet, although the term may also be used for all types. Jonquil is another name that is frequently used to designate any type of narcissus, but properly it refers only to the type with rush-like leaves.

Most popular are the giant trumpet daffodils. They leaves are about one foot long and one inch wide, and the flower stem is about eighteen inches tall, with one large blossom per flowered narcissus, and the

Golden yellow King Alfred and white Beersheba are favorites in this group. The florists, Mrs. R. O. Beckhouse is the famous "pink daffodil." It has a white perianth (outer petals) and shell-pink trumpet. It was the first pink daffodil to appear on the market.

Medium trumpet daffodils are also frequently seen and are ideal garden flowers. They range in color from pure white and cream to combinations of white, yellow, and tangerine.

Pheasant's Eye is a striking example of the Poeticus or Poet's Daffodil. The petals are white and the short, flaring cup is yellow edged with deep scarlet. It has a pleasant spicy fragrance. There is one flower per stem.

The Poetaz daffodils have clusters of small flowers on each stem and are delightfully scented.

Other interesting daffodils include the double-flowered forms, the tiny "hoop petti-

types with tiny pendant flowers.

Narcissus can be misused in beds in a formal garden, or naturalized in an open woodland. Clumps can be planted in a perennial border or in front of shrubs. They can be grown in a rock garden, in planters, boxes or in pots. They will multiply if left undisturbed and year after year will proclaim the glories of Spring.
