It was with great pleasure that we announced last week the official signing up of the first industrial plant to be located in the large Farmington Freeway Industrial Park Area in the west-central portion of Farmington Trownship.

The Diamond National Corporation's division plant which will be the first to go under construction in the industrial park is only the beginning in the total development of the more than 500 acre park, but a very good start, as far as we can determine. Other plants in the park are already being planned, we are told. For the past several years now, the pre-capita value of the Farmington community has been slipping further and further downhill in spite of the fact that we have been adding more and more have been adding more and more

While it still may be hard for many of our citizenry to understand, a good sound community tax base cannot be built with above average homes alone. It takes a balance of commerce and industry.

The valuation behind each child in our public school system recently dropped far enough below the state average that we were labeled as a "distressed school district," and still are. Fortunately, we have been able to maintain a reasonably good school system but it becomes harder and harder to get good teachers and administrators and keep them. Many other districts are raising pay for teachers and administrators so much faster than we that good personnel is being lost.

Rapid development of the industrial park in the township the next five to ten years is the only solution to making Farmington a really healthy community.

It was for this reason that we were so delighted to announce last week the first real tangible sign of a start in this development

to make the development become a reality initial start was actually made when township officials recognized the need for substantial industrial development along with residential growth and decided to zone-the large area for industry despite vigorous opposition from a substantial number of citizens bent on keeping Farmington rural in character. From that time until this; there have been countless hours of behind-the-scenes work being done by members of the Township Industrial Park Committee and township officials in working out details.

There has been the monumental job

There has been the monumental job of getting water and sewer facilities made available to this area; the need to work out numerous planning details and also the time-consuming job of contacting prospective firms to locate in the park.

We praise members of the industrial committee and township officials highly for their unheralded efforts of the past. Much remains to be done to make it the kind of industrial development we want but we are confident that they will continue in the job with the same uniting efforts they have demonstrated in the past.
