**First Presbyterian Church Looks Back on Beginning Here**  
(Editor's note: The first of 10 articles pertaining to the founding of the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington was selected. It was well-chosen.  
ALONG THE "FIRSTS" in the month following was an attendance of over 100, the first baptism, the first Holy Week services, the first Congregational Meeting and the first steps toward church organization. These included the Women's Association, Westminster Fellowship and the Men's Chapter.  
In the spring of the year there was a church, a reality. The 16th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. convened at the Masonic Temple in Detroit. The First Presbyterian Church of Farmington was officially recognized and 11 charter members were accepted.  
In the summer of the year there was a church, organized, with a large group of witnessing Christians and guided by the church. The church was growing. With memberships steadily growing, there was a need for an edifice in which to worship. That need was soon filled.  
They had the support of a young minister from Beaverton, Ore., Dr. A. Geiger. He had the choice of selecting an area for a new church. He chose Farmington.  
There was a growing community with a variety of people, where positions, incomes and interests reached out in every direction, even to the employed. A survey conducted among the residents showed a real desire, a real need for a Presbyterian church to be organized.  
On October 22, 1963, The Farmington Enterprise carried a front page story, headlined "First Presbyterian Service To Be Held Sunday." The story went on to say "A new church will have its birth in Farmington this Sunday, October 27, when Rev. Richard A. Geiger holds the first Holy Communion at Our Lady of Sorrows Church, Sunday, May 3.  
Early in 1954, seminars in churchmanship were inaugurated. Fellowship Suppers were held in various homes. The Presbyterian group was joined with other churches in unified services at holiday time. Meanwhile, Reverend Geiger was received as a member of the Detroit Presbytery.
