

Timely Tips on GARDENING

Crab apples and tulips are early peas will be harvested before mid-July and can be followed in the same space by a late crop of beets, spinach, turnips, or radishes.

Plan the garden so enough space is allowed between the rows for the gardener to walk so he can cultivate and harvest the crop. Space the plants in the row far enough apart so they have room to develop. In a small garden that is cultivated by hand tools the plants and rows can be set closer together than the distance recommended on the packets.

Tall plants should be grouped at one end of the garden so they will not shade low plants. It is also helpful to group those that are susceptible to the same diseases to make control easier. Cabbage, broccoli, and cauliflower are in the same family and are subject to the same ills. Likewise, potatoes, tomatoes and eggplant are related and have related problems.

A soil rich in organic material is ideal for growing vegetables. Commercial fertilizers are of benefit and a "complete" fertilizer should be used. The nitrogen aids leaf and stem growth and is most important for the leafy green vegetables. Phosphorus is important when growing root vegetables such as carrots and beets and also hastens maturity of all plants. Potash, the other major element, increases general sturdiness and disease resistance. The best way to apply the fertilizer is in long narrow

bands along the row about three inches away from the plants. Cover it lightly with soil. Although hardy vegetables could be seeded early in Spring, many have to wait until danger of frost is past. By mid-May it is safe to plant seeds of tender crops and by the latter part of May it is safe to set out plants of tender vegetables.

Some vegetables, such as beans, are seeded where they are to grow and cannot be transplanted. Others, such as the tomatoes, eggplant, and peppers mentioned above transplant easily. Others that can be transplanted include asparagus, beets, broccoli, celery, Swiss chard, cabbage, lettuce, onions and parsley.

A half pound of green bean seed will plant fifty feet of row and should yield about 20 pounds of snap beans or two and one half bushels of pole beans. Twelve tomato plants require about fifty feet of row space and should yield about twelve pounds per plant.

In addition to growing the family's favorite vegetables, it is fun to experiment with something that has not been tried before, such as Chinese cabbages, soybeans, succini, celery, popcorn or herbs. Even if no space is available for a vegetable plot, the gardener can still grow a few vegetables. Tomatoes can be staked at the back of the flower bed and leaf lettuce or carrots make an attractive edging.

Small cherry tomatoes can be grown in pots or hanging baskets on a patio. Lettuce, radishes, and chives can be grown in a window box.
