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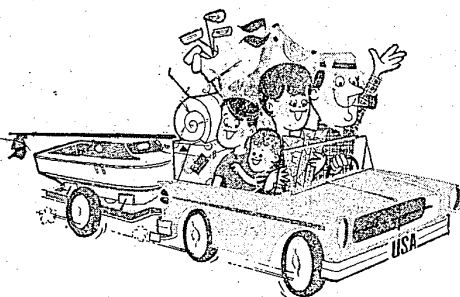

Usually, the average grade increases during the second semester because of the extra effort put forth by seniors as they approach graduation. If the present trend continues, this year's student body should break the record during the second semester.

To be placed on this honor roll, a student must maintain a 2.0 or higher grade point average while carrying a minimum of 12 credit hours.

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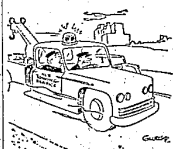
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
