

Under the direction of Mr. Warren McKenzie, Student Council advisor, the day was a huge success with profits totaling approximately \$300.

Students earned this money moving lawns, washing windows, wedding, planting, putting up screens, ironing, and doing general housework. The work was done on a platoon system with a group of four or five workers reporting to each home for duty.

A car wash was held at the school with at least ten students washing cars continuously. Workers and customers alike commented on how Mr. McKenzie ruled up his sleeves and "tackled the white walls" and served above and beyond the call of duty.

Proceeds from this activity will go toward a scholarship fund to be awarded to a student on a basis of scholarship and financial need.

O. E. Dunckel Spring Concert To be Presented May 22 and 23

The O. E. Dunckel Junior Chorus will present "With A Song In My Heart," their seventh annual spring concert, on Friday, May 22, and Saturday, May 23.

Richard Rodgers' "With A Song In My Heart" will be the opening number of the third portion of the concert and will feature the Girls' Choir. Other numbers performed by the Girls' Choir will include "How Are Things In Glocca Morra," "Waitin' For The Evening Train," "Before I Kiss The World Goodbye," and a rhythmic interpretation of "I Ain't Down Yet."

The fourth portion of the concert will feature the Melodians. This singing and dancing group will perform "You're Just In Love," "When The Red, Red Robin Comes Bob, Bob, Bobbin' Along," "A San Francisco Medley," and "Dry Bones," a lively arrangement by Livingston Hearhart.

FOR THE FINAL portion of the concert will feature the Mixed Choir which features such numbers as "I Could Have Danced All Night," "Summertime," "Gonna Build A Mountain," and "The Cante Home." The traditional number, "You'll Never Walk Alone," will close the concert.
