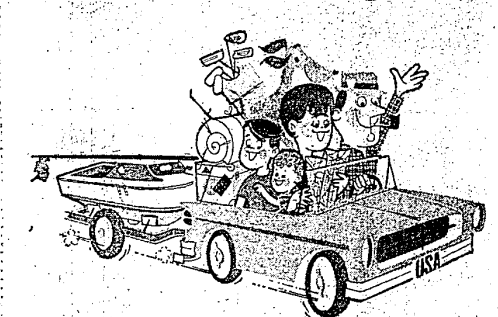

## AAU Wrestling Title Won by Stan Secosky

Stan Secosky, the Our Lady of Sorrows wrestling star, won the Eastern Canadian AAU Championships first place berth in the 154-pound weight division on May 9.

Miller of the Harb Park Recreation Club. By pinning the final opponent to face him, Secosky wrapped up the top honors, having accumulated the fewest number of black points, as scored under AAU rules. The last man, Al Mitchell, was pinned by Stan in the time of 7:25. Mitchell represented the Canadian Youth Club and is a former Canadian National Champion.

It was the third tournament championship won by Secosky this year and was one of his most brilliant efforts to date.

## FHS Golf Team Places 15th in St. Regionals

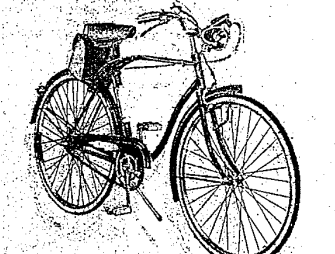

## Falcon Track Team Takes 2nd At Regionals

Feathers ruffled, the Falcon undermen flew into the Regional meet at Bentley last Saturday, bringing in second place.

Ron Smedley set his own personal record in the broad jump with a fourth place and captured a third in the high hurdles, thus qualifying for the State meet.

The 880 Relay of Robinson, Agoston, Moore and Lockwood took a first in the meet with a time of 1:33, getting the afternoon finals off to a good start.

Next on the winning list was Dennis Hunt with a spectacular 1:20 mile run. Gary Schulze and John Lockwood then brought in the first two places in the 440 with times of 50.8 and 51.4, respectively. Schulze's run of 50.8 broke the previous record of 51.4 in 1953 by Grimshaw.

Gary Lockwood then followed with a fifth place in the 100 Yard Dash and a second in the 220. Last on the agenda was the One Mile Relay which took second with a 3:28 time, also qualifying for the State meet.

The first three places in the 800 were won by the Falcons on Saturday's meet. Thus, Farmington will end up nine men, several of them doubling.

## Falcon Netmen Notch 2nd Win

Winning a close 3-2 decision over Waterford last Friday, the Falcon tennis team racked up their second league win in seven tries.

Had it not been for the poor playing of Farmington's first and second singles players, Wes Orr and Mike Bacon respectively, the Falcons would have had an easy victory over the relatively weak Waterford squad. However, the two losses forced the racketeers to win the other three matches.

The number two doubles team of Terry Bacon and Mike Messler had to fight a lengthy three set battle to give Farmington its first point of the afternoon.

Number one doubles, consisting of Dave Cornwell and Gary Arnold, had an easier time of it as they beat their opponents in straight sets, 6-0, 7-5.

Dick Smith, playing at three singles, also won handily, 6-1, 6-1.

## Bike Rodeo Set For Saturday At Beechview

The Safety Committee of the Beechview PTA, headed by William Flathery of Kimberley, is sponsoring a bike rodeo to be held on Saturday, May 23, from 9 to 12 a.m. at Beechview School.

All grade-schoolers and pre-schoolers in the Beechview School district will be eligible to enter the rodeo, provided that their bikes are two-wheelers at least 20 inches and without training wheels.

Each bike will undergo a safety check before the competition on the following points: 1. Handgrips fit tightly. 2. Seat firm. 3. Wheels not wobbling. 4. Reflector light on rear of bike. 5. Brakes working properly. 6. Pedals in proper working order. 7. Handlebars not oversized so that the rider does not reach above shoulder height. 8. Tires in good condition.

The bikes passing the safety check will be awarded strips of colored tape, and will be eligible to compete in the rodeo. Two games are planned for the young riders to test their skill in handling their bike. The first, "Hit the Target," is a game in which the rider must pitch bottle caps into cans placed 15 feet apart on the ground while continuously pumping the bike. The second, "Ride the Plank," will require the rider to navigate on a plank 10 inches wide and 24 feet long.

Twenty-four trophies will be awarded the winning contestants and will be presented by Dick Linn and Jim G. Bors. In addition, every youngster present will receive a brochure containing the history of the bike, games, and safety hints. Any bike owner whose bike does not pass the safety check can receive his reflectorized tape by correcting the faults and returning this brochure, signed by his parents, to Ken Lachman, principal of Beechview, at any time in the future.

An officer from the Farmington Township Police Department will be on hand for the May 23 rodeo, and will talk briefly to the children on the importance of bike safety. The rodeo, stressing safety hand-in-hand with fun, is anticipated to have a big turnout and some keen competition for those 24 trophies!
