A post meeting will be held June 12, at 8:30 p.m.

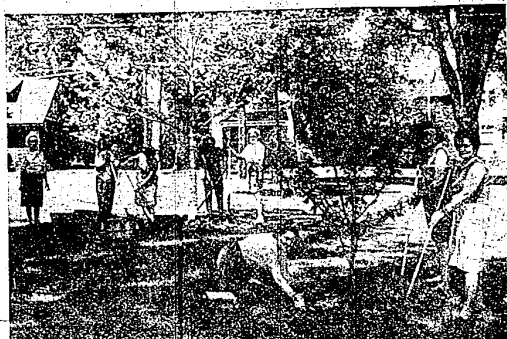
Toastmistress Club to Meet
