OK St. Fabian's Use of Lighted Ball Diamond

The Farmington City Council approved the request from St. Fabian's Catholic Church for use of the lighted baseball field in the City Park on Monday night. The Parish softball team plays in the Northwest Catholic Softball League and has agreed to pay \$5 per week for use of the lighted field.

City councilmen were in agreement the lighted field in the City Park at Shawassie and Power roads should be put to use by all citizens and groups in the community, and the St. Fabian's softball team is the third group to gain a regular night for use of the lighted diamond.

TIE JUNIOR CHAMBER of Commerce, which provided the lighted ball diamond, was the first local group assigned a regular night for use of the diamond and the Farmington Ladies Softball team is the other group which has been assigned a regular night for use of the lighted diamond.

It was pointed out by City Manager John Dinan that still another group, still in the organizational stages, has plan to request a regular night for use of the lighted baseball diamond.

City councilmen agreed that all requests for available night should be handled on a first come, first serve basis until such a time as a permanent working arrangement can be established for use of the lighted ball diamond. It was further agreed that the \$5 fee for use of the lights by groups should be continued.

Special preference will also be given to local groups over requests from groups outside the community for use of the lighted baseball diamond.

Falcon Track Team Retains Conference Championship

Farmington's power house track team retained their championship by winning the 1964 Inter-Lakes Conference track meet at Walled Lake, May 27. The team point total of 49 1/2 was a come-from-behind effort to put the cindermen on top of the league for the second consecutive year.

Coming out of the field events, FHS found itself in a fourth place behind Southfield, Pontiac, Northern, and Walled Lake who had from two and a half to three times the Falcons' points already. Behind Farmington's Bill and White, rested Berkley and Waterford who stayed there to capture fifth and sixth. Individual field event honors went to Neil Warriner (Shot Put - 5th); Ron Smedley (Broad Jump - 3rd); and Dan Clifford (High Jump - 5th).

Buzz Jenks of Southfield broke the Conference high jump record with a leap of 6'10" in repeated first place effort.

An 880 Relay Team of John Lockwood, Gary Lockwood, Buzz Robinson and Bob Negrohian started the rally toward the top by running third for 3 points. Dennis Hunt ran 4:23.1 to pick up five points and repeat as top man in the mile run.

The next three events saw 14 points and one conference record fall to Falcon cindermen. Smedley picked up three in the High Hurdles and Joe Watson and John Karwowski added a combined four in the 880 yard run. Watson's 2-minute flat is the best time ever turned in by a FHS sophomore. Karwowski's 2:01.8 is also his best time.

Gary Schultz and Dick Moore led in the open 440 until the very last when Moore was shaded by two foes. Schulz's man's man's persuasion.

The race finish of the evening came from John and Gary Lockwood in a nine point tally in the 220 yard dash. Both led throughout the race and "older brother" John was clocked at 22.4. Lockwood beat the old record held by a Walled Lake man in the preliminary running of that event. The officials are still undecided as to his right to the new Inter-Lakes record.

A Mile Relay team of Moore, Watson, Hunt and Schulz captured first place honors and the conference record. Their time of 3:29.5 is also a Falcon Varsity record.

At the end, the total points stood as follows: Waterford 21 1/2; Berkley 20 1/2; Southfield 19 1/2; Northern 16 1/2; Walled Lake 14 and Farmington 49 1/2.

Falcon cinderman once again brought home the cake as they captured a third place trophy in the Oakland County meet, last Friday.

Taking points in the meet were Gary Lockwood, who captured third place in the 100 yard dash and a fourth in the 220. Ron Smedley then leaped for a third place ribbon in the broad jump.

Dennis Hunt, running against All-State miler, Bob Richards, turned in a good time for a second place. The 440 was paced by Gary Schultz, who brought in a sixth place.

Larry Hunt, Karwowski, and Watson grabbed a first. Ending a great season, Farmington tracksters brought home their fifth trophy, their sixth of the season.
