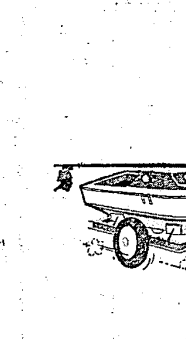

State Freeway Expansion Set

State Highway Department crews have started making surveys for the Highway Department's expansion of nearly 40 miles of Interstate freeway in the Detroit area.

The work, which will cost an estimated \$14.2 million, will be done between 1965 and 1967.

In most cases, an additional lane will be built on the inside of the present divided four-lane freeways.

ON SOME SECTIONS, revisions will have to be made to existing overpasses and interchanges.

On newer sections of freeway, original plans provided for the future addition of another lane.

Addition of the new lanes is expected to meet anticipated traffic volumes predicted for 1965 and 1967.

Sections of freeway to be expanded include 17 miles of I-96 between Brighton and Farmington.

FHS Teacher Begins Biology Research

Mr. Gerald Taylor, FHS biology instructor, left last Friday for North Texas State University to begin a summer of research in the field of bacteriology.

All persons responsible for cancer patients who are to be cared for at home are urged to contact the Michigan Cancer Foundation, a 501(c)(3) Drive agency, 4811 John R. Detroit (or any of its information centers throughout Wayne, Oakland, Macomb and Monroe counties) for such necessities as hospital beds, commodes, wheelchairs or orthopedic supplies.

All of these items are freely available on an indefinite loan basis.

"WE ARE FULLY aware of the burden imposed on those caring for a cancer patient, particularly in the area of such an expensive item as a hospital bed—and want to make it clear that any such sickroom equipment is free and available."

Physicians releasing cancer patients from hospital care continued care at home are urged to make these services of the Michigan Cancer Foundation known and to recommend that such help be solicited.

Other information centers besides the headquarters in Detroit are located in Berkley, Dearborn, Mt. Clemens, Monroe, Pontiac and Wyandotte. All offices are listed in the telephone directory.

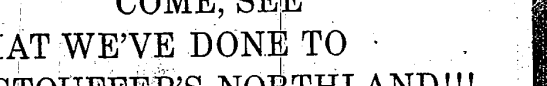
