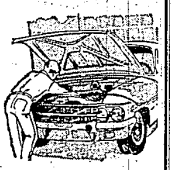

## Electric Heating Show Van To be Here This Coming Week

For the first time this coming week Farmington citizens will have an opportunity to see Detroit Edison's new traveling Electric Heat Show.

"The huge van housing the show will be located in the Downtown Farmington Center parking lot from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m. from Tuesday, June 16, through Saturday, June 20.

Forty feet long, custom constructed by Fruehauf Trailer and outfitted by Detroit Edison personnel, the van tells the story of electric heat from installation to insulation.

"THE EDISON Electric Heat Show has the dual purpose of informing the home owners and instructing the contractor," said a spokesman for the Detroit Edison Company. "We designed the traveling displays to be entertainment with a purpose."

Entrance and exit doors, at the side of the van open from the bottom and pull down to the ground to provide self contained short stairways complete with steps and railings. The entrance door remains open during visiting hours but the interior is protected by a curtain of air which allows the door to remain open even in severely cold weather.

ALL SETUPS are operational and a visitor to the show will be able to experience the instant response of electric heat by adjusting the thermostat controls himself.

Proper installation of vapor barriers and insulation is also demonstrated, as well as the use of humidistats to control indoor humidity.

All the equipment is displayed in simulated, home-like surroundings to show how unobtrusively electric heating units fit into a room.

In addition to latest electric heating units, the show also features the most modern in door and outdoor lighting equipment.

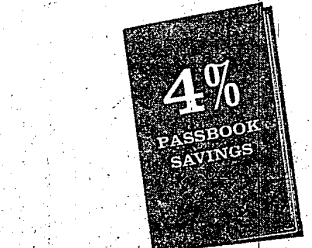
