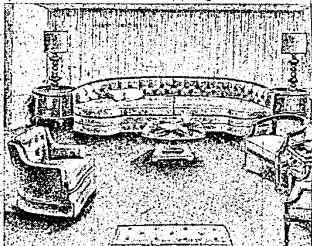

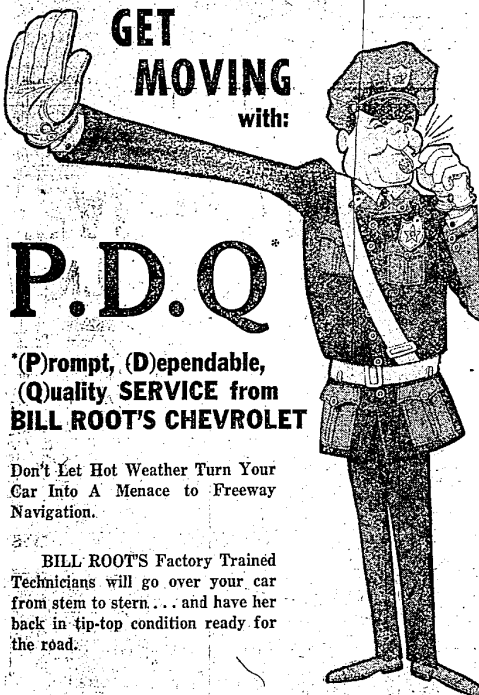

## Six More in Troop 116 Become Eagle Scouts

District scout executives, school officials and local civic leaders joined Troop 116 of Farmington in Court of Honor ceremonies on Friday, June 12, at North Farmington High School. Six young men advanced to the rank of Eagle Scout, making a total of 20 Eagle Scouts in this very active troop. This is a record unequalled in this area, according to George DeCoursey, scoutmaster.

"This was one of the most significant events of the year in local scouting and an important milestone for Troop 116," DeCoursey said. "Few troops in the nation have had so many boys achieve Eagle rank in one troop."

In addition to having six advance to Eagle Scouts, five previously honored Eagle Scouts received bronze palms. As one of the state's top rated troops, Troop 116 has been selected to serve as the Governor's Honor Guard and as guides at the historic Fort Mackinac from August 15 until August 27. This marks the third straight year this troop has been awarded this high honor, DeCoursey noted.

In addition to the Eagle presentations, 13 other boys in Troop 116 advanced to higher ranks. Among the top executives who attended and made the Eagle presentations were Al Graebner, chairman of the Ottawa District, and W. Wells, assistant executive of the Clinton Valley Council.

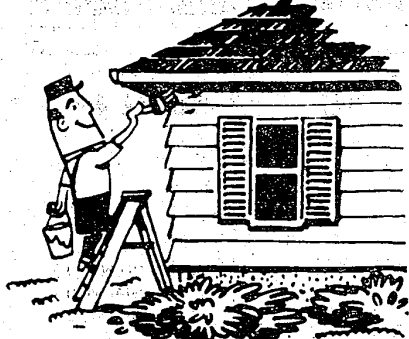

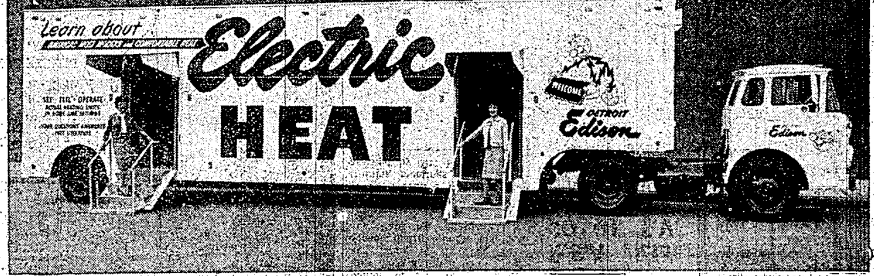
