

School Board Okays \$20,000 in Equipment

The Farmington Board of Education, at its regular meeting Monday night, authorized the expenditure of a little over \$20,000 for new equipment needed at various schools.

Necessary items for the Farmington and the North Farmington and Gill Road schools additions, to be paid out of the building and site fund, amounted to about \$4,700.

Window coverings, library shelving and equipment and furniture, some for new classrooms and some for replacement, totaling about \$15,500, were authorized to be purchased from the general fund.

ment. In planning the program, made during the senior year's openings occur.

After being accepted, students will be in school the first three or four periods of the day and on the job in the afternoon. Students will work a minimum of 15 hours a week and be paid, probably at the same rate as other part-time workers. They will earn one credit per year for on-the-job training. In addition, students will be required to take two courses directly related to their jobs as well as any courses required for graduation.

STUDENTS will be required to be in school and at work each day. If they are unable to attend school, they are not to go to work. If a student is at work but not in school on any given day, he will receive an "E" for that marking period.

A follow-up program of evaluation will be conducted for all students. Performance will be evaluated jointly by the coordinator and the employers and the coordinator assumes responsibility for all final grades.

The Co-Op program was outlined and discussed at both high schools before the end of the past school year. The students were enthusiastic about it and of 30 applicants, 30 have been accepted.

BAUMUNK reported that he has met with personnel people at Botsford Hospital, Crowley's, Sears and Demery's and that the plan was well-received. He feels that the opportunities for office, clerical, and sales training in the Farmington area are good. Opportunities in trade and industrial occupations are limited in number and present problems regarding transportation for workers under 18. However, he has hopes that progress can be developed in this area.

Baumunk stated that he had made presentations of the co-op program to the Junior Chamber of Commerce, the Farmington Board of Commerce, the City Manager, and the Town Supervisor. He indicated that he would be pleased to speak to any other interested groups at any time.

Start Work On New Restaurant

The old Wanda's Restaurant building site at the corner of Grand River Ave. and Orchard Lake Rd. has now been cleared and work started on a modern new restaurant building to be known as the Treasure Chest Restaurant.

Work on the new restaurant building started this week. The restaurant will be operated by Arnold F. Felt and his wife, Mrs. Felt, who have been in Farmington Township who has made his home here for approximately seven years.

Subdivision Plat Approved By Township Bd.

The Farmington Township Board took action at their Monday, June 22, meeting approving the preliminary plat of Thompson - Brown Company's Canterbury Commons Subdivision planned in the south one-half of Section 3 in Farmington Township.

An approximately 70-acre parcel of land is slated for development into 147 lots, located just north of 13 Mile Road, midway between Farmington Road and Orchard Lake Road.

Thompson - Brown's Canterbury Commons will be developed under the township's planned unit development with 15 acres or 21 percent of the subdivision area reserved for park development. The majority of the lots planned in the subdivision are wider than the 50-foot minimum width specified in the township ordinance.

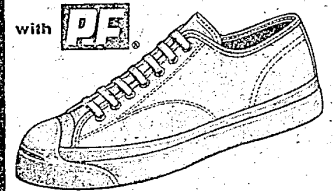
