54 in Area Get Special Testing

Doctors at the Yates Memorial Clinic, a Torch Drive Clinic, examined 54 Farmington residents during the past year.

They were among 11,646 adults who took the cancer tests. Approximately two percent of those tested were found to have malignancies of which they were unaware.

The Yates Clinic is operated by the Michigan Cancer Foundation, which receives \$800,000 a year from Torch Drive contributions, the largest per capita gift awarding fighting cancer of any community in America.

The services of the Yates Clinic are available to anyone over 21, regardless of race, color or creed. The patient need not be referred by a physician, but the report of the examination is always sent to his own doctor.

Torch Drive contributions make it unnecessary to charge for the examinations. A deposit of \$5 is required at the time an appointment is made. This is returned when the patient comes in for examination, or if the appointment is a canceled more than 48 hours in advance.
