Judge James S. Thorburn Seeks Election to Co. Circuit Court

Circuit Judge James S. Thorburn has announced his candidacy for the Oakland County Circuit Judge election November 3, 1964.

Appointed a Circuit Judge by Governor George Romney, Judge Thorburn has served as one of Oakland County's seven Circuit Judges since September 6, 1963.

JUDGE THORBURN was elected to three terms and served for twelve years as trustee, vice president and president of the Royal Oak School Board prior to his appointment as Circuit Judge.

A native of Royal Oak, Judge Thorburn holds degrees from Michigan State University and the University of Michigan Law School. Judge Thorburn and his wife Jeanne have three sons, ages 12, 15 and 19.

He practiced law in the Oakland County Courts for sixteen years prior to ascending the bench. As City Attorney for the cities of Pleasant Ridge and Huntington Woods, and as attorney for the Birmingham School District, Judge Thorburn was often engaged in public litigation in his private practice.

JUDGE THORBURN is a past president of the Oakland County Bar Association, and also the South Oakland Bar Association. He is a member of the Pontiac Rotary Club, a trustee of William Beaumont Hospital, and an Elder in the First Presbyterian Church of Royal Oak.

Alice Polley On Dean's List

"Alice Little Polley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. C. Polley of 26400 Brandywine Road in Farmington, is on the Miami University Dean's List for the spring semester. The Dean's List is comprised of all undergraduates who achieved average grades of B or above for a course load of 12 hours or more, totaling 1,368 names. The Miami registrar's office has announced.

The list represents undergraduate students only. These amounted to 7,683 of the 8,315 total enrollment for the Oxford campus that semester. Therefore, 25.2 per cent of Miami's undergraduates achieved average grades of B or above for the minimum full-time course load.

Although men outnumbered women in the semester's total undergraduate enrollment, 4,682 to 3,641, the women were in a substantial majority on the Dean's List. They were ahead 32 to 32 among straight-A winners; 247 to 203 in the "High Honor" bracket; and 771 to 633 in the "Honor" bracket.
