## Local Veteran Famous For Miraculous Death Escapes

Spending their eighth Christmas in Farmington is the Allen Heyn family, consisting of Allen Heyn, his wife, and their three children, Marsha, 17, Jeffrey, 14, and Steven, 13, living at 23037 Green Willow in Kendallwood.

Many friends and neighbors (those whom they have associated with for many years) still do not know that Allen Heyn is the one that was written up in the "Believe It or Not" by Ripley as the Allen C. Heyn who was saved three times in three minutes by his equipment while serving as a gunners mate in the Navy during World War II. His story is told in Volume 1 of the American Heritage Encyclopedia, New Illustrated History of the United States, World War II Volume, now being sold in the A & P Stores throughout the nation. The eight pages of history were taken from the

original Naval Documents.

**THE DOCUMENTARY** tells how Allen Heyn, a member of the Juneau cruiser in Guadalcanal action on Nov. 13, 1942, was stationed at his anti-aircraft gun, located at the fantail when a Japanese torpedo hit the Juneau's magazine.

All that was left of the cruiser was the stern. It threw Heyn against the gun mount. He had on a steel helmet which was crushed and his skull fractured as a result. When he went to get up to go overboard, he felt pain in his foot and found that he couldn't get it loose because a metal shield of some type had fallen across the instead of the kapok life jacket. It couldn't budge it. The ship was sinking and he knew he had to get off. He grabbed one of the kapok life jackets that were lying around on deck, and held it, without even putting it on. The water closed in around the ship and it went down. The sheet of iron across his foot loosened from the pressure of the water and released his foot and then the buoyancy from the life jacket brought him back to the surface.

**HE RELATES** his experiences and those of the other men that were on donut-shaped life rafts. There were about 10 men when all the life rafts got together. There were about twelve men on the life raft with Heyn. One of them was George Sullivan, one of the five Sullivan brothers who went down with the Juneau.

The oil from the feed tanks of the cruiser was thick on the water and sickened many of the men. By the fourth day, the men began to separate and the men were beginning to get dehydrated and Building Co. Navy keeps illirious, being without food or the household capably in tact.

water and the hot sun beating on them through the day and then facing the cold, cold of the night.

**THE SHARKS** were thick and took their toll of the men. Heyn throughout this time tried to keep up the morale of the men in which they needed it if they were to survive. After eight days on the raft, Heyn was the only one left. On the ninth day, he was picked up by a passing destroyer, and taken to an island hospital to recover.

During his recovery, Heyn was offered scholarships to Annapolis and Dartmouth by the Navy but he chose to go into the submarine duty instead to help settle the Juneau's score.

Over 700 crew of the Juneau, there were only ten survivors.

**THE STORY** has been printed in the Life Magazine, Saturday Evening Post, The Sign Magazine and others. Many newspapers throughout the country, such as the Detroit News, The Chicago Sun, Jackson Observer and others, have printed the story. Heyn was honored in Jackson, Michigan in 1962 by Mayor James N. House who proclaimed an Allen Heyn Day.

Allen Heyn and his family reside quietly in this community, not wanting to draw attention to themselves. Marsha, their oldest daughter, is attending North Farmington High School and is editor of the school paper. Jeffrey also attends North Farmington High School and is a student at Durckel Junior High.

## MSU Coeds Get Job Training Toward Careers in Retailing

It happens every fall at Michigan State University: a group of coeds leave the campus near mid-term to take jobs in Midwestern department stores.

And they depart the classroom with their teacher's blessing.

Last month, on schedule, 30 MSU senior women left for department stores in seven cities. While they are outside the classroom, though, the coeds are still going to school.

**MARYLU JOHNSON** of 21015 St. Francis Street in Farmington is one of the 30 MSU coeds participating.

They are undergoing a seven week training program, designed to prepare them for careers in retailing.

Their teacher is Miss Demetra Mehas, assistant professor of textiles, clothing and related arts at MSU. She will spend the next four weeks visiting the stores and assessing the progress of her students.

The sojourn from classroom to department store is an annual one for girls studying retailing of textiles clothing in MSU's College of Home Economics.

Their fall quarter of study is especially designed to accommodate the sevenweeks of field training. They take five weeks of accelerated course work in fashion industries: clothing and textiles merchandising, and

prevision training and experience in retailing.

Early in November this year's group of retailing seniors packed up and went to department stores in seven cities: Detroit, Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, and Toledo. They remained in the stores until Dec. 24.
