Treasurer's Report

At the regular monthly meeting of the Village of Wood Creek Farms Council, Tuesday night, January 7, the Treasurer's quarterly report was presented and a nearly \$400 increase over the quarterly report of September was suggested (in fact) that a dividend be declared.

Wood Creek's current Treasury contains a total of \$10,534.85 with \$3,821.09 in the General Fund, \$3,133.59 in the Major Road Fund and \$1,580.20 in the Local Road Fund. The Village's Treasury had a total of \$10,135.13 as of September 30, 1963.

To Address SAE Convention

Three Farmington residents will speak at a luncheon at which the Elmer A. Sperry Award will be conferred on automotive engineers who made outstanding contributions to development of a major drive train component.

Major General Alden K. Sibley, Commanding General of the U.S. Army Mobility Command, will speak at a luncheon on Tuesday, January 14, held as part of an all-day discussion of Army aircraft. Other speakers include a father-and-son team night planned to interest boys in engineering careers and a program to bring engineering students together with leaders in the profession.

Approximately 8 percent of the water bills were presently being paid by mail and that very few would probably take advantage of a second establishment at which to pay their bills even if one was designated. Four or five disadvantages which might result from having the bank as a second point at which to pay water bills were cited by Treasurer Coulter.

COUNCILMAN Henry Forst, proponent of the plan for having the bank as a second place where water bills could be paid, questioned the validity of the possible disadvantages cited by the treasurer. He held firm to an earlier contention that he felt this would be a tremendous service to many citizens and particularly due to the fact that the bank is open on Saturday while the City Hall is not.

Other members of the Council, however, seemed very willing to go along with the recommendation of the treasurer on this matter.

SAE spokesmen emphasize that "automotive engineering" is more than just the engineering of automobiles; it is a large and important part of the word "automotive" in a "general" sense and applies to vehicles for land, air, sea and space.

The Society's meetings function as clearinghouses for exchange of information among specialists in all these fields.

TWELVE OF THE 63 Congress sessions will deal with the aeronautical side of automotive engineering. These will cover such subjects as vertical and short take-off and landing aircraft under development in the United States and Europe, business and utility aircraft, and regenerative engines for aircraft. Other sessions will cover truck tractors, engines for cutting metal, means for improving cold-climate operation of construction equipment, improvements in design of engines for passenger car use, in-board marine engines, and a number of other topics.

The Exposition serves as a showcase for hundreds of suppliers to the automotive industry. Exhibitors will demonstrate the latest in fasteners, bearings, engineering materials, pumps, upholstery materials, filters, manufacturing equipment, and scores of other engineering products and services.

The forthcoming Exposition will feature also a sampling of experimental cars built by auto makers to try out new engineering ideas and a half-acre display of the newest in Army and business aircraft.

Edward N. Cole, vice-president in charge of car and truck group, General Motors Corp., will be a speaker.
