Farmington split a Sunday, double-header with Milford, July 12, losing the opener, 3-2, and winning the nightcap, 4-0, to round out their action for the week.

Southfield played at Farmington last night to begin action this week. Farmington will travel to Walled Lake on Friday night, July 17, and play a Sunday doubleheader with Berkeley on the Our Lady of Sorrows baseball diamond July 19, to round out this week's action.

THE FINAL TWO games of the regular season are scheduled for Wednesday and Friday next week. Farmington travels to Troy on July 22 and closes the season with a home game against Walled Lake on Friday, July 24.
