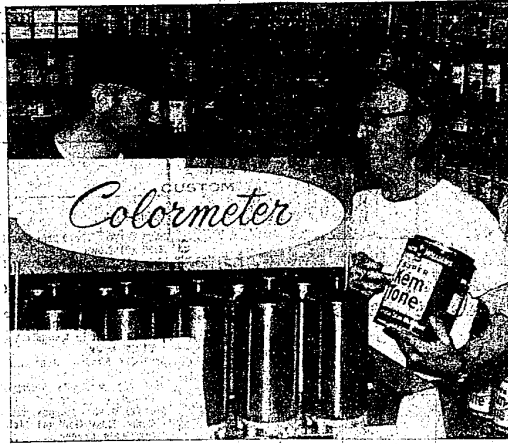
## Echoes of Pleasant Valley Farms

## Children's Aid Society Helps Families Here

The Michigan Children's Aid Society, Oakland, a Torch Drive agency, cared for 11 Farmington and nine Farmington Township children who needed foster homes, adoption homes, or supervision in their own homes during the past year.

They were among 455 youngsters who, because of neglect, abuse, or deprivation needed help from outside their immediate families.

THE SOCIETY is prepared to help both neglected children and neglectful parents.

Complaints of abuse, neglect, and deprivation are investigated by trained social workers from the Home Service Department of the Society. Every means of restoring normal family relationships is explored. Parents are helped to recognize the reasons for the behavior and to realize the effect of their conduct on the lives of their children.

The separation of children from their parents is an extreme measure recommended by social workers to the juvenile court judge only when separation would be helpful to both the child and his parents.

The daily fee for camping at state parks in Michigan is \$1.50. An additional charge of 25 cents per day is made if electricity is used.

## At National Math Institute

Clifford C. Broderson of Farmington, a teacher at Farmington High School, is one of 29 teachers from 14 states attending the Memphis State University summer institute for high school teachers of mathematics.

The institute, sponsored by the National Science Foundation, began June 22 and will end Aug. 14. Courses in the institute are aimed at giving high school mathematics teachers an opportunity to study modern aspects of mathematics instruction and serve as a refresher course for fundamentals, as well.

Dr. H. S. Kaltenborn, chairman of the mathematics department at Memphis State University since 1946, is director of the institute, the third such held at Memphis State.

All teachers attending the institute received a stipend of up to \$500, an allowance of up to \$120 for each dependent to a maximum of four, and travel allowance up to \$80.
