

City of Farmington Council Proceedings

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington was held on August 3, 1964, at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Lindbergh.

ROLL CALL: Councilmen Forrest, Lindbergh, Peterson and Thayer present. Absent: Brotherton.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Dignan, Clerk Quinn, Attorney Kelly and Chief Foltz.

Minutes of Previous Meeting: Motion by Peterson seconded by Thayer that the minutes of regular meeting of the Council held on July 20, 1964, be approved as published. Motion carried, all ayes. Forrest abstained.

Reports From City Manager:

A. Planning Commission Proceedings, July 27, 1964: Planning Commission Proceedings read and placed on file.

B. Report on City Inspection on Sanitary Sewer South of Valleyview: City Manager Dignan reported that the Oakland County Department of Public Works crew had completed their inspection of the alternate sanitary sewer south of Valleyview. The sewer is structurally sound with isolated exceptions at one or two locations. Detailed report with photographs of the deficient areas will be submitted to the City Council.

C. TV Inspection showed that there are no manholes north of Valleyview to the Rouge River, approximately 900 feet and it was necessary for the County to break through at the half way point to complete their TV inspection of the south half of the sewer. The City intends to repair this hole by the construction of a manhole at this location which is necessary for rodding and cleaning purposes.

D. Robert J. Kelly, City Attorney, reported that the City has the opportunity to buy back the sewer rights to service this sewer.

E. City Manager Dignan recommended that, following the report by the City Attorney, the City should decide on their approach of the installation of this manhole and utilization of this sewer to relieve the Bel-Aire sanitary line.

F. City Manager Dignan submitted copies of the report from the Oakland County Department of Public Works on the closed street. The inspection of sewer West of Lakeview from approximately 120 feet North of Valleyview to approximately 400 feet North of Grand River.

G. The Council discussed that abandonment of parking on Grand River, causing a hardship on the local merchants the number of traffic lanes available, the possibility of using the State Highway property between the curb and sidewalk and requesting that the State Highway Department paint the lanes to guide the traffic entering into the City.

H. Comments on the above discussion were made by Ralph Yoder, 31661 Lamar, W. Allen Nelson, 27088 Warner and E. Baiden, Farmington Center Manager.

Grand River: The County recommended that the City repair broken pipes at the foot of the street, 100 feet 9 inches from the start which would be North of the pavement on Valleyview Street.

The City Manager was instructed to submit an estimate of cost to repair above described broken pipe and number of manholes needed following review of photographs to be submitted from the County.

B. Report Estimate of Cost of Fencing Oakwood Cemetery: City Manager Dignan reported that he has received proposals on fencing of the Oakwood Cemetery for a six foot wire. There is approximately 1600 linear feet required with a maximum of four terminal posts. Our bid proposal stated that fencing would cost approximately \$2.80 per linear foot and the terminal posts \$25.00 each or an estimated total cost of \$4,000.00. Funds would be available from the 1964 surplus Contingency Fund if the Council desires to fence the Cemetery.

C. City Manager Dignan stated that since the last vandalism occurred on July 20, 1964, the City has been securing the entrance into the Cemetery from Grand River at 8:30 p.m. and no further vandalism has occurred.

The Council agreed that the Oakwood Cemetery be fenced and suggested the proposal include fencing the City tanks.

Motion by Peterson supported by Thayer to authorize the City Manager to receive firm bids for the fencing of Oakwood Cemetery and City Water tanks.

ROLL CALL: Forrest, Lindbergh, Peterson, Thayer.

NAYS: None.

ABSENT: Brotherton.

Motion carried.

C. Report on Fire Hose Bids: City Manager Dignan reported that seven bids were received and tabulated in the City Clerk's office. Friday, July 11, 1964, at 10:00 a.m. for the purchase of 500 feet of 2 1/2 inch fire hose. The lowest bid was received from Fire Trucks, Inc. at \$1.20 per linear foot, total \$600.00.

Motion by Peterson seconded by Forrest to award the bid for the purchase of 500 feet of 2 1/2 inch fire hose to Fire Trucks, Inc. at \$1.20 per linear foot, total \$600.00.

Motion carried, all ayes.

D. Report Regarding Utilization of Highway Property Between Curb and Sidewalk for Parking: City Manager Dignan reported on the utilization of State Highway property between the curb and sidewalk for parallel parking at the East City limits to Orchard Lake Road.

He stated that from observation and the opinion from the local merchants the number of traffic lanes available, the possibility of using the State Highway property between the curb and sidewalk and requesting that the State Highway Department paint the lanes to guide the traffic entering into the City.

Comments on the above discussion were made by Ralph Yoder, 31661 Lamar, W. Allen Nelson, 27088 Warner and E. Baiden, Farmington Center Manager.

Signal Light at Alta Loma and Farmington Road: A discussion was held on the necessity for a signal light at Alta Loma and Farmington Road.

Motion by Lindbergh seconded by Peterson that the City Manager prepare a design and estimate of cost for a signal light at Farmington Road and Alta Loma and report at next Council meeting.

Motion carried, all ayes.

QUINCY MEETING DATES: Motion by Forrest seconded by Thayer that the next regular meeting of the City Council be held on August 24, 1964, to the absence of the City Manager. Motion carried, all ayes.

Motion by Peterson seconded by Forrest that the regular meeting of the City Council in September be held on September 14, 1964, to the Day Holiday. Motion carried, all ayes.

CLAIMS AND ACCOUNTS: Monthly bills.

Motion by Thayer supported by Peterson that claims and accounts for July 1964, be approved for payment as submitted.

ROLL CALL: Ayes: Lindbergh, Peterson, Thayer, Forrest.

NAYS: None.

ABSENT: Brotherton.

Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: Motion by Peterson seconded by Forrest that meeting adjourn. Motion carried, all ayes. Meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.

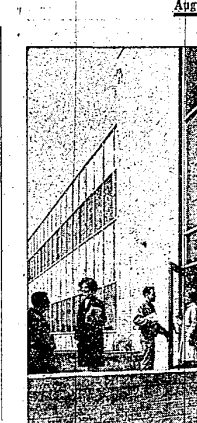
