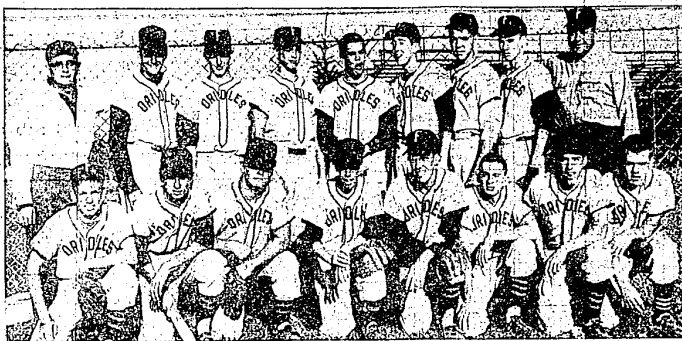

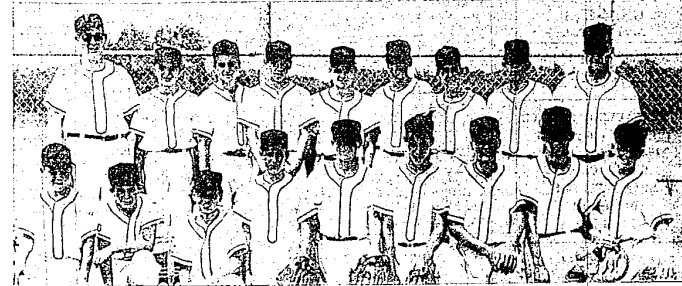

### Call Athletes For Aug. 26, 27 Physical Exam

Director of Physical Education and Athletics in the Farmington School District, John K. Cotton, this week announced the dates for the 1964 annual physical examination program for all junior and senior high school students planning on participation in school sports during the 1964-65 school year.

Farmington doctors will give of their time on the mornings of August 26 and 27 to provide all boys with the physical examination required before they can participate in school sports. All boys planning on going out for sports, whether at a public, parochial or private school, as long as they are residents of the Farmington area, are urged to take advantage of this physical examination program.

AN IMPORTANT part of this year's physical examination program is the medical history report that has to be completed by every boy's parents before he can be allowed to participate in school sports. This report MUST be filled out by the parent and accompany each boy at the time of the regular physical examination. The parent DOES NOT have to accompany the boy for the physical, only complete the medical history report and make sure he takes it with him when he goes for his physical.

The physical examinations will be given on Wednesday, August 26, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. at Farmington Senior High School. All senior high athletes will be scheduled first at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, with junior high athletes and all others scheduled at 10 a.m. on the same day.

North Farmington High School will be the scene of physical examinations Thursday, August 27, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. Senior High athletes report at 9 a.m. and all others report at 10 a.m. DON'T FORGET YOUR MEDICAL HISTORY REPORT—HAVE IT COMPLETED AND SIGNED.
