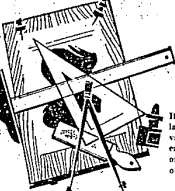

James F. O'Neil Warns Against Runaway Inflation in State

James F. 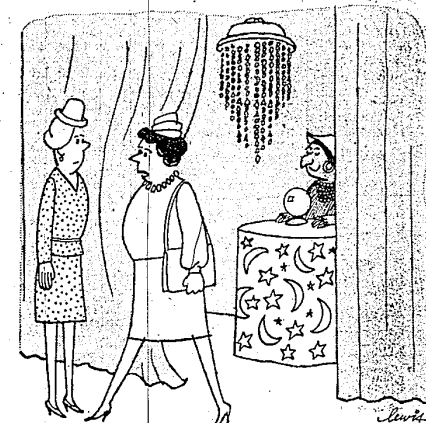
