There are three Republican and three Democratic candidates running for their respective party nominations and a place on the November ballot in the race for the new 19th U.S. Congressional District seat. The new 19th Congressional District includes the townships of Farmington, Redford, Brandon, Commerce, Groveland, Highland, Holly, Independence, Lyon, Milford, Novi, Orion, Oxford, Rose, Springfield, Waterford, West Bloomfield and White Lake; and the cities of Farmington, Keegoonah, Pontiac, South Lyon, Sylvan Lake, Walled Lake, Wixom, Northville and Livonia.

John H. Burke

John H. Burke, a Democrat, lives at 3181 Stamen Circle Drive in Farmington with his wife and their four children. Burke is a graduate of the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (Bachelor of Science, 1945), attended Wayne State University and received an L.L.B. Degree from the Detroit College of Law in 1952.

A practicing attorney, Burke is a member of the Michigan State Bar, Detroit Bar Association, the Farmington Democratic Club, the Parent Teachers Guild and the Detroit College of Law Alumni Association.

He served as an Engineer Officer with the U.S. Merchant Marines from 1943 to 1945 and served with the U.S. Navy from 1940 to 1943.

Burke has made his home in Farmington for the past 8½ years, previously residing in Redford Township. Burke is presently with the law firm of Lesinski, Paruk and Miller, attorneys at law, in Detroit. His family includes Cathy, 7, Susan, 6, Terry, 10, and Debra, 12. This will be his first try for public office.



Wm. W. Brashear

William W. Brashear, a Republican, served three terms as Mayor of Livonia (1958-62). He is 50 years old, married and has three children. He lives at 16159 Southampton Court in Livonia where he has been a resident for the past 16 years.

Brashear is an attorney with the law firm of Brashear, Brashear and Mies. He attended the University of Michigan and the Detroit College of Law, graduating from the latter in 1928. He began working for a law firm at the age of 18 and at age 21 was admitted to practice and handled cases in the Michigan Supreme Court, U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals and the U.S. Supreme Court. He is a member of the Michigan, Detroit, and American Bar Associations and is a former member of the Oakland County Bar Association.

During World War II, Brashear served as a Special Agent FBI and with the U.S. Navy. He was appointed as Livonia Township Attorney in 1949 and was instrumental in the incorporation of the City of Livonia. He was elected a member of the City of Livonia Charter Commission.

Brashear served on the Wayne County Board of Supervisors for ten years where he served on numerous committees.

He furnished legal services, without charge, in incorporation of Livonia Chamber of Commerce, St. Mary Hospital of Livonia, Livonia Masonic Temple Assoc., Livonia Goodfellows, Inc., Senior Citizens of Michigan, Livonia Rotary Youth Foundation, Livonia General Osteopathic Hospital, and many other organizations. He is a member of Board of Directors of Bank of Livonia.

Of Registration

Drive for GOP

Mrs. Charles Stevenson, of 22822 Biddlestone, Farmington Township, has been named chairman of the GOP Registration Drive for the Republican and Campaign District, an announcement made today by James F. Preish, head of the Party's County Registration Drive.

The 2nd District includes the townships of Commerce, Farmington, Lyon, Milford, Novi, Rose, South Lyon, Walled Lake and Wixom.

Mrs. Stevenson's job will be to get Republicans registered by October 5 for the general election on November 3. He emphasized that it is important for people to know that State law requires a person to register if he has not voted in the last two years.

The estimated number of eligible voters in the County is 521,000 and of these, approximately 58,000 are unregistered Republicans.

Billie S. Farnum

Auditor General Billie S. Farnum was born April 11, 1916, in Saginaw. The oldest of ten children, he spent most of his school years living on a farm in Watrous, graduating from Vassar High School in 1933.

After graduation, Farnum worked with the Civilian Conservation Corps before going with the Pontiac Motor Division in 1936. There he became active in the labor movement in which he held many elective and appointive positions. During World War II he worked in an advisory capacity to the Office of Price Administration and the War Production Board.

Former Governor William Farnum appointed Farnum to the Michigan State Fair Commission in 1951. In 1952 until 1954 he was an Administrative Aide to the late United States Senator Blair Moody.

In 1955 he was appointed Assistant Secretary of State, and on July 1, 1957, he was elevated to Deputy Secretary of State. In January 1960, he was appointed Deputy State Chairman of the Michigan Democratic Party, the office he held until his appointment as Auditor General by Governor John B. Swainson on October 23, 1961. He was elected to a full two-year term in November 1962.

In addition to his governmental work, Farnum is active in the Boy Scouts, FTA, the Elks, the Plymouth Congregational Church of Lansing, and is a past president of the Pontiac Shrine Club. He was a member of the Pontiac Community Chest Board for nine years, helping develop the plan for the first Michigan United Fund Campaign.

His extensive political activity ranges from work as Democratic precinct delegate in Oakland County to the post he now holds.

Farnum married the former Maxine DeCoe of Vassar in 1936. They have three sons and four grandsons.

Complete Slate for Precinct Delegates

A complete slate of candidates for Democratic precinct delegate positions in Farmington Township will appear on the September 1 Primary ballot, Farmington Democratic Club chairman Aldo Vagnozzi announced this week.
