The state board of canvassers accepted petitions from four parties this year, while the fifth party... Socialist Labor... was on the doubtful list pending a ruling by the Attorney General.

Aside from the two major parties, the Democratic and Republican parties, the others which definitely will appear on the ballot are the all-Negro Freedom Now party and the Socialist Worker parties. The Socialist Worker party was the only minor party to have appeared on the 1962 ballot.
