

Farmington's Thomas M. Hoover On Ramchargers Racing Team

It was inevitable that Thomas M. Hoover of Farmington, one of the founders of the Ramchargers racing team, should find his way into the auto industry although he trained for a career in science and holds a master's degree in physics from Penn State.

Tom's father, veteran automobile mechanic Charles B. Hoover, of Huntingdon, Pa., pleased with his son's early flair for tinkering and repairing, encouraged him in the development of mechanical skills. In high school and college, the young Pennsylvanian maintained his lively interest in cars. He kept pace with all of the changes and, in his spare time, built, repaired and rebuilt any vehicle that came his way.

At Juniata College, Huntingdon, Tom majored in physics. This was natural, too, because it implemented his mechanical training and knowledge of energy transformation. A ranking student and consistent member of the dean's honor list, he was active in Sigma Pi Sigma, national physics society.

WELL VERSED IN theory and years of practical experience that started in his father's auto shop, the 34-year-old physicist is presently racing coordinator on Chrysler Corporation's Engineering Staff. Today, his leisure time is still devoted to automobiles. Since helping form the Ramchargers racing team in 1958, his chief avocation has been building and racing and repairing, encouraged him in the development of mechanical skills. In high school and college, the young Pennsylvanian maintained his lively interest in cars. He kept pace with all of the changes and, in his spare time, built, repaired and rebuilt any vehicle that came his way.

Before he could launch his career, the Korean War erupted, and he became a sergeant in the U.S. Army Transportation Corps.

Returning from the Korean conflict with three battle stars, he continued his education at Penn State. Completing graduate study with a M.S. in physics, he joined Chrysler Engineering in 1955 to work on fuel injection development.

WORKING ON CARS at his regular job—and away from it—soon led Tom and some of his engineering cohorts to form a drag-racing club, which they named the Ramchargers.

Scholarly Tom, one of its first officers, is a jack-of-all-trades in the Ramcharger's busy garage in Roseville, Mich., but his specialty is engine assembly. Each Ramcharger has a specialty, but all are versatile enough to "pitch in" on any job. Teamwork is the key to this careful preparation of their now familiar white and candy apple red-striped Dodge "Candymatic" (super stock automatic).

Shortly after helping organize the team, Tom found time to court and marry Margaret Elizabeth Wengel, a native Detroit, and a Chrysler Corporation executive secretary. The
