Judge H. R. Carroll's Career Started at Ice Cream Social

Macomb County Circuit Judge Howard R. Carroll, a candidate for the Second District Court of Appeals, operated a ferris wheel in Flint, cut bread in Kalamazoo, sold shoes in Lansing, worked on a road building gang in Clinton County, played in a dance band and taught school to finance his legal education.

Judge Carroll was born on a farm near Ovid in Clinton County. After living in Lansing for two years, his parents returned to a farm near St. Johns. He and his two sisters trudged to a one-room county school house until his parents moved to nearby St. Johns where his father had purchased a grocery store.

Judge Carroll was a chubby-freckled boy of nine when he first evidenced interest in the law. He explained: "Dad and I were attending an ice cream social at a country church near Owosso when a big fine-looking man drove up in an Overland car. It couldn't have been more than eight feet long but it was the largest automobile I had ever seen."

It was Edward J. Moinet, then the Clinton County Circuit Judge and later on a Federal Judge. "Dad pointed to Judge Moinet's fine clothing and car and said, 'See if you study real hard you can be a lawyer first and a judge later on.'"

was elected Circuit Judge. Judge Carroll has been on the circuit bench in Macomb County eight years. He commented: "If I had not attended that ice cream social at that country church and seen Judge Moinet, it is hard to say where I would be now. Perhaps I would be selling ice cream."
