## Saturday Art Classes Open

Saturday art classes for Farmington Area students will begin October 3 at Farmington Senior High School. Farmington Public Schools, in cooperation with the Detroit Institute of Art, will again sponsor a series of five Saturday art classes for interested students of the area.

Beginning October 3, grades 1 and 2 will meet at 10 a.m. and grades 3 and 4 will meet at 1 p.m. through Saturday, October 31. Classes for grades 5 and 6 will begin on October 10 and will extend through December 12 with a week out for Thanksgiving.

An enrollment fee of \$7.50 covers all expenses of the series of five workshops. This provides an instructor and all materials according to Robert Benjamin, Elementary Art Consultant, who announced the new series. The classes are planned to interest new students in art to provide a challenge to talented students, and to complement the art program in the public schools. The facilities of the Detroit Institute of Art are called upon to provide inspirational materials for the various crafts and techniques introduced during the five sessions.

Each week, 150 Scouts and leaders from all sections of the United States join the Service Corps. The Scouts are housed at Fort Totten, an Army post located twenty minutes from the Fair.

AT THE FAIR, the Scouts staff "The Wonderful World of Scouting" exhibit of the Boy Scouts of America. They perform live demonstrations of basic Scout skills including emergency first aid, wildlife bird identification, knot tying, compass demonstration, and a fire building. Exhibit guests are invited to participate in many of the activities.

At the World Friendship Hospitality Center of the exhibit, the Scouts greet international visitors. As they hoist the visitor's national flag beneath the 22-foot model Unisphere they "live" the World's Fair theme of "Peace Through Understanding."

ROBERT MOSES, President of the New York World's Fair 1964-65 Corporation, has asked the Boy Scouts of America to "represent the youth of the nation." At the Fair, the Scouts serve as aides for visiting dignitaries, hosts for underprivileged or handicapped children's groups, and as honor guards at many state, federal and international pavilions.

## Citizens Action Committee Being Formed in Farmington Twp.

As an aftermath of the extremely lively Farmington Township zoning board meeting on August 27, a group of Farmington residents met at the Franklin Fairways home of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Schlesinger to organize the Farmington Citizens Action Committee.

The mutual feeling of the group was that small, protesting groups can accomplish little individually and that a wider approach to the subject of better local government is needed coupled with better methods of communication between the subdivisions, a spokesman for the group said. It is also the feeling of the existing nucleus of this group that in a government unit at the township level there exists the perfect opportunity for the voice of the people to be heard, if only they will avail themselves of it.

A STATEMENT of aims was drawn up as follows, the group's spokesman said. "We as residents of Farmington Township, believing good government to be the province of all citizens, establish the Farmington Citizens Action Committee."

"The goals of this committee are:

- "1. To maintain a non-partisan group which will observe the various functions of the township government and report its findings to the community.
- "2. To preserve the rural beauty of the township primarily as a residential area.
- "3. To vigorously oppose spot-zoning and any attempt by any commercial, industrial, real estate, or private interests to rezoned any area now zoned as residential until a study has been made and an adequate master plan prepared.
- "4. In order to avoid falling into a pattern of complacency or complacency, our officers shall rotate on a quarterly basis, and must be replaced each year.
- "5. We will expressly avoid the endorsement of any political party.
- "6. We will endorse an individual only upon receiving his pledge that he will support our enumerated principles. His qualifications must justify such an endorsement.
- "7. We demand and insist upon integrity in our elected and appointed officials."

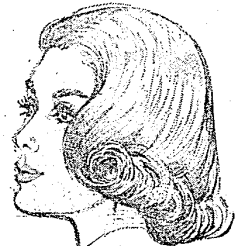
