This annual report of the Farmington Public School District is prepared to give you a better understanding of your school facilities and the educational program that they make possible. Farmington has had a continuous building program for the past 15 years. The illustrations on this page show how our school building program has kept pace with our growth in student population. The Farmington Public School District now consists of 15 elementary schools, 3 Junior high schools, and 2 senior high schools. Plans are now completed and construction will soon be started on a new elementary school (Lanshire), in addition to East Junior High School, and an addition to North Farmington High School. We are also planning additions to some of our present elementary buildings.


Buildings, however, are only a part of the educational problems of a growing community. We have a well qualified staff of teachers and other employees and endeavor to maintain adequate supplies and equipment, reasonable class sizes and healthful and safe conditions in all of our schools.

Farmington Senior High School has been continuously accredited since 1927, and North Farmington High School received its accreditation last year when it had its first graduating class.


We wish to take this opportunity to thank all who have actively participated in and loyally supported the school program. We hope that we will continue to warrant this support.
