Local Women Support Second Meadow Brook Music Festival

It's "Encore, 1963" for Oakland University's Meadow Brook Music Festival launched to nationwide acclaim only last summer as the first phase in the development of a complete performing arts center for the area.

Mrs. Rinehart S. Bright, who serves with her husband as general chairman of the project, Monday morning called to gather at the University more than 100 key women for coffee, a musical preview of the season ahead, and to insure another summer of sold-out performances for the series of concerts.

Her general area chairmen, charged with setting up committees in 60 sections of Metropolitan Detroit, will be Mrs. James E. Curtis Matthews, Ben D. Mills, Walter F. Skinner and Richard C. Van Dusen.

The imagination of the entire area was caught up by the project last summer. Only a dream in January it came to striking reality by July. In the period the stunning Howard C. Baldwin Memorial Pavilion was built at a cost of \$300,000 in a sylvan setting on the estate of Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson which is the University campus. Mrs. Wilson is honorary chairman of the Meadow Brook project.

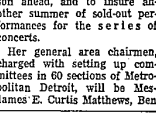

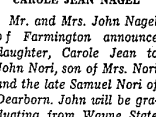
