

Detroit Auto Show Closes Sunday With Near Record Attendance

There are two worlds at the 49th annual Detroit Auto Show and visitors are enchanted by both.

The first is of the present-day with the glitter and glamor of all the new 1965 models. The second is the world of the future, as represented by the many "dream" cars and "idea" cars at the show.

Public reaction to the Detroit Artillery Armory Exposition has been outstanding, according to Harold C. Johns, show chairman. With the show running through Sunday (Jan. 17) the attendance 115,000 record of last year is expected to be broken.

Most of the attention has centered around all the new 1965 model U.S.-made cars. Show officials say the public appears to be in a buying mood, as evidenced by the '64 car sales record of 8 million-plus.

The Auto Show presents a unique opportunity for the car shopper to see and compare all the '65s, and all under one roof. The many "dream" cars at the show are drawing oohs and aahs, particularly from the younger set. Among such models are the Comet Cyclone Sportster, Dodge's Charger II, three Rambler specials from AMC, the Imperial LeBaron '64 trimmed in gold, Pontiac's "Tiger" convertible with tiger-fur trim, an experimental Thunderbird Landau with pistol-grip steering, the Ford Galaxie LTD "Executive" with built-in TV, and Chevrolet's Monza Jr. for the 69-cent set.

Other attractions getting special attention from the crowds include the Cadillac display featuring working accessories; the Presidential Lincoln which was used by Presidents Truman, Eisenhower and Kennedy; the displays showing sportsmen how life in the wilds can be fun with a camper truck; the Plymouth Sport Fury convertible which will be the pace car at the 1963 Indianapolis 500; and the 1963 Buick Skylark Gran Sport which is making its public debut at the show.

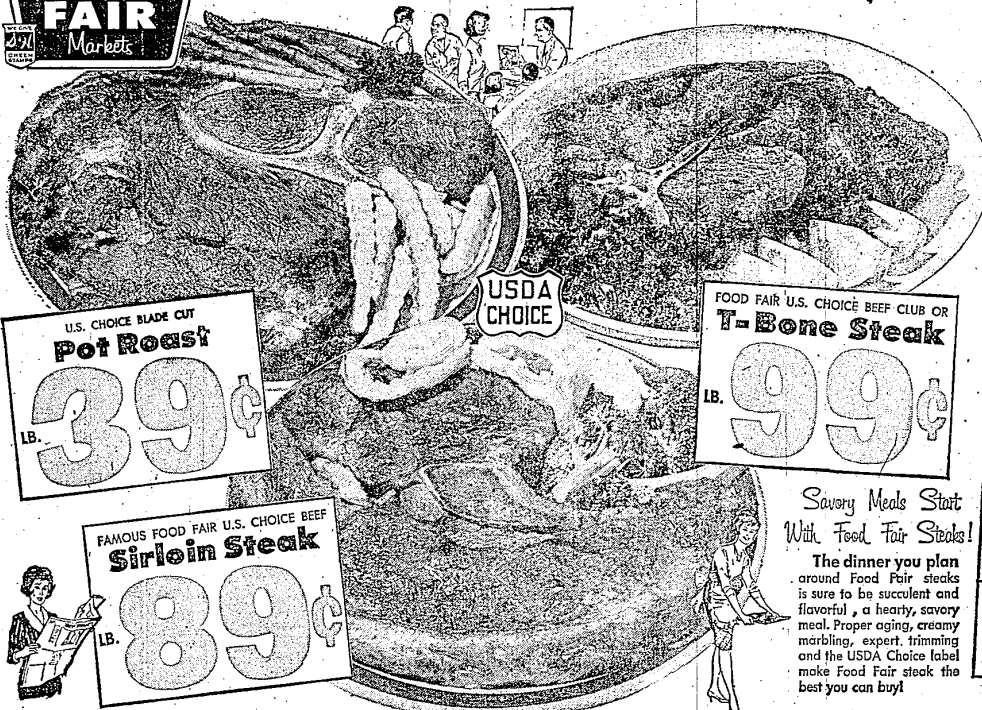
